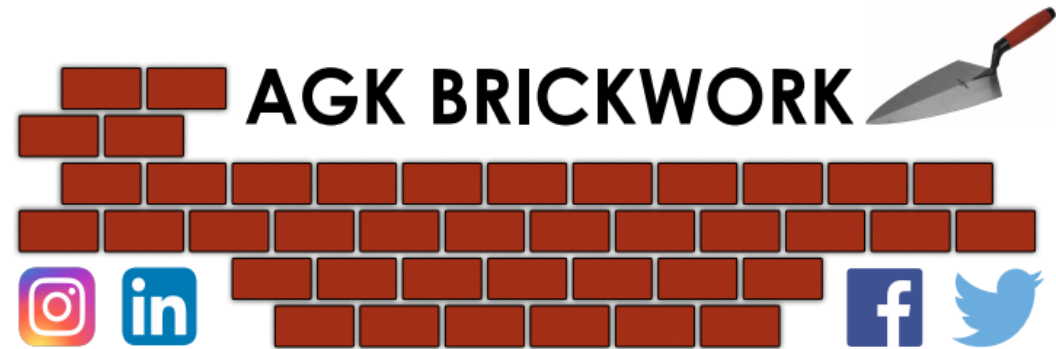

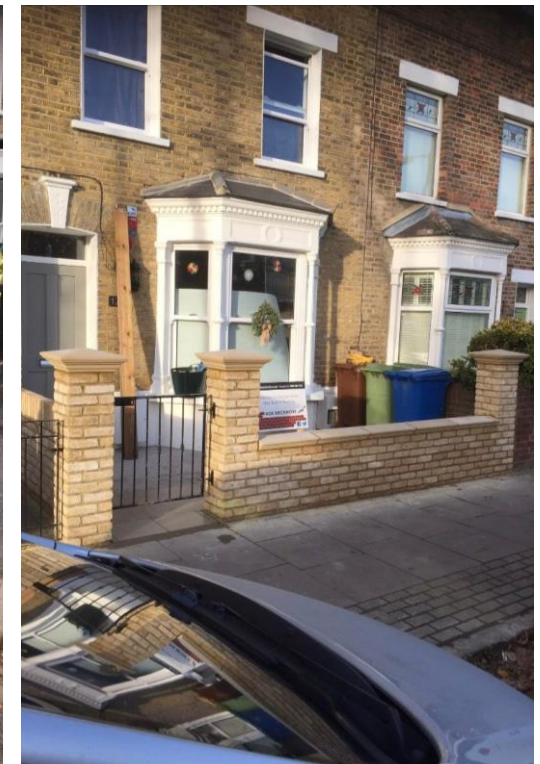

Fisher FC 2020/21 season tickets are now available, with a £10 discount (half your membership fee back!) for Fisher members

We have set season ticket prices at the same level as last year at £100 for adults and £60 for concessions (before the £10 deduction for members). With two extra sides in the league this year (Balham and Tower Hamlets) this covers 20 home league games so is giving football for a fiver!

Purchasing a season ticket will support the club in more ways than just financially as it will ease the logistics of match day admittance where we are going to have to record the names and addresses of all those in attendance and reduce the burden on the gate of handling card payments at the same time as we move to cashless entry. We would urge as many members and supporters to consider supporting the club in this manner.

Adults and concession members get a £10 rebate on their season ticket, meaning that your membership –and share of ownership of the club – is half price if you become a season ticket holder.

In addition to this, under 16s season cards are now completely free if bought in conjunction with an adult or senior season card.

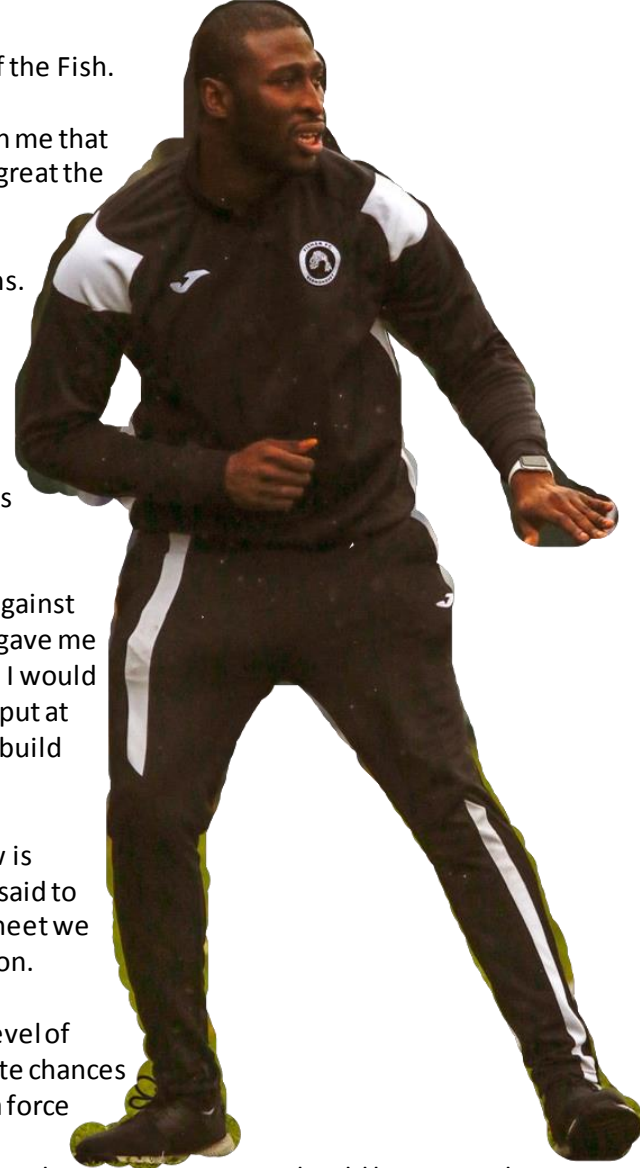
Keeping 3 clean sheet in a row is something im proud of. Like I said to the boys, if we keep a clean sheet we don't lose any game this season.

Balham FC was formed in 2011 in order to provide player progression into open age football for the hugely talented, high achieving age group teams of Balham Blazers FC, which was founded by Greg Cruttwell in 2001.

Having won back-to-back promotions in 2011/12 and 2012/13 Balham did the league and cup double in the Surrey South Eastern Combination in 2013/14. In 2014/15 Balham finished in a promotion position again, in the Surrey Elite Intermediate Football League, however promotion was denied due to Combined Counties League facility requirements not being met.

Having moved to ground share with Cobham FC, in order to meet the facility requirements, Balham finished as runners up in the SEIFL in 2015/16 and as a result were promoted to Division One of the Combined Counties League for the 2016/17 season.

The club had an exceptional first league campaign at Step 6, finishing in a promotion position for the sixth consecutive season and winning the London Senior Trophy.

In 2017/18 the club had an equally exceptional season, finishing 5th at Step 5 in the Premier Division of the CCL and winning the London Senior Cup.

2020/21 will be the club's fourth season at this level after flirting with relegation in 2018/19 and then having a null and void season in 2019/20 due to COVID-19.

Having begun on Wimbledon Extension, before moving to Cobham and then to the Wibbandune Stadium, where the club ground shared with Colliers Wood Utd, Balham have been on the move again in 2020, this time to the Mayfield Stadium, where the club has embarked on a two year ground share agreement with AFC Croydon Athletic.

Moving location has meant that The FA have moved Balham side ways from the Premier Division of the CCL into the Premier Division of the SCEFL (South East Counties Football League).

Fresh off the back of an impressive win against Horsham YMCA in the Emirates FA Cup on Tuesday, the Fish arrived in Crowborough in good spirits ahead of the SCEFL Season opener.

For the first time since taking the reins in 2019, Manager Ajay Ashanike named an unchanged Starting XI, with a slightly different substitutes Bench as he went looking for an opening day win.

Right from the off, the Fish were on the front foot, playing some superb attacking football and controlling possession for long spells. The first real effort of the game came in the seventh minute, when Jamie Yila left two defenders chasing shadows before seeing his low cross beaten away by the Crows keeper. The danger wasn't properly cleared although the referee deemed an attempted bicycle kick was a foul, so the move was cut short.

Yila continued to impress and linked up well with Jacob Katonia and Josh Biddlecombe to create a couple of decent chances, with Jack Gibbons, Luke Thomas Rob Brown taking the reins down the opposite wing, but the Crows back line held strong. The best chance of the half saw Katonia pick the ball up after a slick break away from a Carpanini free-kick. In acres of space Katonia unleashed a long range effort, curving towards the far post, but the Crowborough keeper positioned himself well to make a good save.

The second half started off in much the same vein, with the Fish continuing to press forward looking for an opener. To mix things up Biddlecombe was replaced by Lemba, who came on and caused the Crows some problems with his physical presence.

A succession of corners certainly kept the pressure up, but still Crowborough held firm, but with the chances getting closer each time it seemed like only a matter of time until the breakthrough would come. Rocha came on in place of Gibbons to freshen things up, and again there was a flurry of corners.

Then, just after the hour mark, it seemed to all that the deadlock had been broken. Yila carved out some space, released Lemba who slotted the ball in to an open goal. As he turned away to begin his celebrations, and as the Fisher Faithful began to celebrate, the offside flag was spotted and delight quickly turned to despair.

Shortly after came another run of corners, but a collision between the Crowborough keeper and someone in amongst the crowded back post area quelled the threat on this occasion.

Time began to run out, and with the Fish back line enjoying a solid display and now an ever quieter affair, the traveling fans began to accept the inevitable. For the second season on the trot, the season opener ended goalless and a long way from home.

It was however a positive performance, with lots of attacking football, and a defensive display that ensured Dan Carpanini only got his gloves dirty collecting a couple of corners. Plenty to learn from and plenty to work with!

Man of the Match- Sam Fitzgerald. Nothing got past him in the air, dominated his bit of the pitch throughout.

- Head to Old Kent Road and join the Westbound A201.
- At Elephant & Castle join the southbound A3
- At the Junction of Oval Tube Station, bare left to join the A23 Brixton Road
- Stay with the A23 to Streatham, then continue straight (as the A23 bends to the left), to join the A216
- Stick with the A216 heading south-west towards Mitcham
- At The end of the road, you will come to a roundabout. Take the second exit to head in to Mitcham Town Centre.
- In Mitcham Town Centre, due to roadworks between there and the football ground, we recommend you turn left at the traffic lights near Lidl, then head east out of town on the A236.
- At the first roundabout, take the second exit, then at the second roundabout take the second exit to head towards (and then past) Mitcham Junction Station.
- Turn right on to Goat Lane (you'll notice a Pub called the Crown of Mitcham on your right).
- Follow Goat Lane as it becomes Middleton Road.
- At the Roundabout, take the third exit to join to join Green Wrythe Lane (going north). At the end of the road turn right on to Bishopsford Road.
- Follow Bishopsford Road until you see the ground on the right (just before the road closure)

By Public Transport

- The closest Railway station is Mitcham Junction, where you can join the Wimbledon Bound tram service to Mitcham, then walk along London Road to the ground.

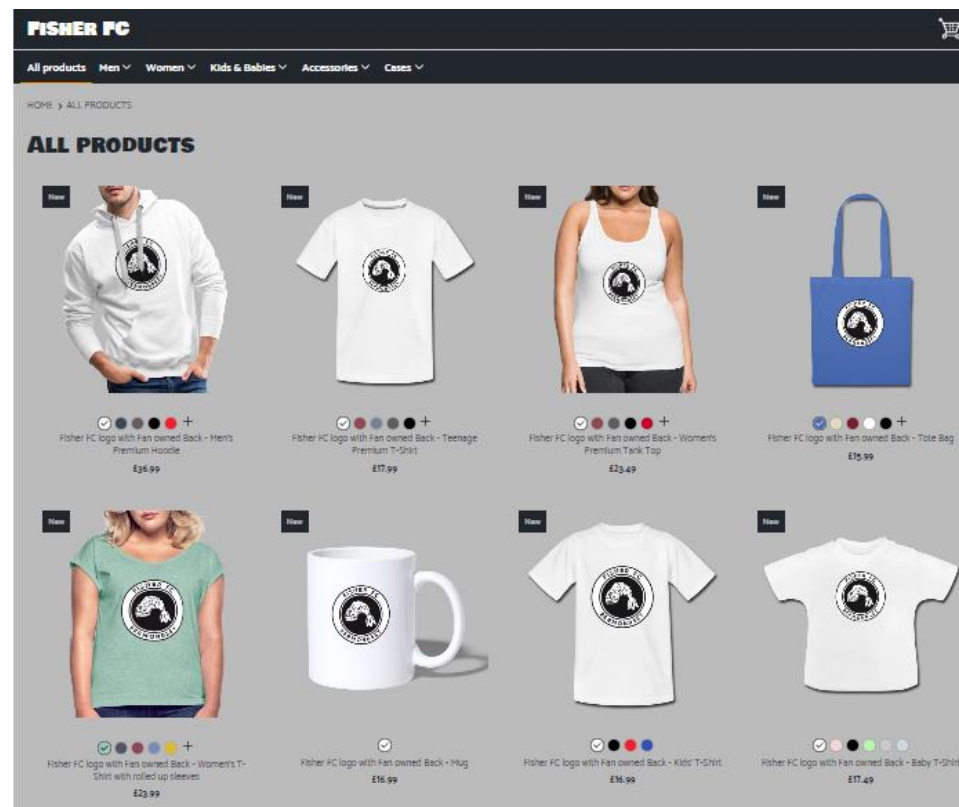

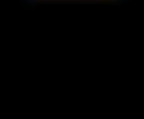
