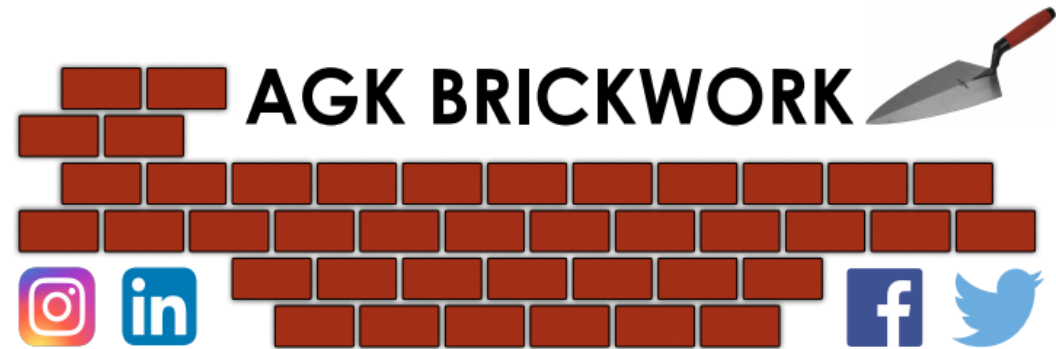

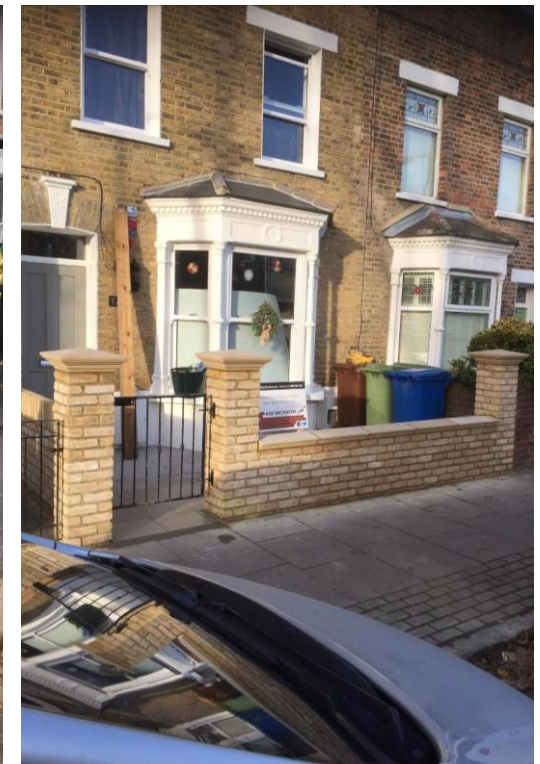

TRAVELLING BY CAR

Head away from Rotherhithe through New Cross to Lewisham. From Lewisham take the southbound A21 out towards Catford. In Catford, turn left to join the One way system ring road, then take two right to stay on the one way system, then left to re-join the Southbound A21 towards Bellingham and Bromley. Turn right at the traffic lights just after a Homebase Superstore (also on the right) to join Beckenham Hill Road (A2015) and follow the road in to Beckenham towards Beckenham Junction Station. Continue straight past the station and stay on the A2015 until you get to a cross-road junction with the A222. Turn right to join the A222, passing through the High Street, then turn left just after a Zizzi Restaurant to join Village Way. Follow Village Way out of the town and stay with the Road as it becomes Eden Park Avenue, and the entrance to the ground will be on the right just before a railway bridge towards the end of the road.

TRAVELLING BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Head to Eden Park (served by trains running between Charing Cross or Cannon Street and Hayes (Kent). When leaving the station, turn right, walk past a small garden centre a Sainsbury's Local, and then turn right on to Eden Park Avenue. The entrance will be found on the left just past the railway bridge.

Bus Services 194 (Lower Sydenham to West Croydon), 356 (Shirley-Upper Sydenham) & 358 (Crystal Palace-Orpington) all stop outside Eden Park Station.

Please remember to wear a facemask when using public transport unless you are exempt.

MATCH DETAILS

Entrance prices at The Croydon Arena are £8 for Adults & £4 for Concessions and children.

Refreshments are available from the clubhouse and tea bar throughout the afternoon, which can be found behind the goal as you enter the ground.

Glebe FC were founded (as the junior side Glebe Globetrotters) in 1995 by chairman Rocky McMillan and his wife Grace. Initially based in West Wickham and starting with just a sole Under 8's team, the club progressed through the age groups. Regulars in Kent's Youth Leagues we won every junior trophy possible – including 10 London County Cups.

After their exceptional beginnings as a Junior side, their committee voted to form a Senior section in 2010 and the newly established team joined the Kent Invicta League (KIL) in 2013-14. In 2014, we also won the prestigious London FA Standard Charter Community Club of the Year Award, as voted for by the Executive Committee of the London FA.

But for years Glebe were nomads, seemingly unable to secure a permanent home. For the first two seasons the senior side ground shared with Holmesdale, but, in 2014, we signed a 25 year lease to take over Old Elthamians Rugby Club. This was a historic day in the club's history, when we had a base to be a focal point for sport in the community, at last.

With the help of the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, we have since built a modern sports complex. The club resides in 15 acres in Chislehurst, comprising 5 pitches, a new stadium pitch, a separate floodlit training area, gym, bar and reception rooms. In 2020/21, there are over 25 Junior teams, one ladies senior side, and of course the First XI, with over 350 playing club members.

Glebe FC's history as a senior side is brief - but exciting. Life began in 2013-14 finishing 10th following up with 7th in 2014-15. The next season we experienced the disappointment of narrowly missing out on promotion, finishing 3rd behind Bearsted and Sheppey United. However, we did win the Kent Invicta League Cup and the London FA Senior Trophy.

In 2016-17 the Kent Invicta League became the SCEFL's First Division and Glebe went up as champions - clear by 12 points. One highlight from last season (2019/20), was an impressive run in the FA Vase, when we reached the 4th Round, knocking out five opponents (Guildford City, K Sports, Peacehaven and Telscombe, Fisher and Newhaven) before a tough 3-0 defeat at favourites Stowmarket Town.

This is now our 4th season in the SCEFL Premier Division. Gary, Alexander, the ex-Millwall player, has committed himself to the club for another season. We are also delighted to have retained several key players from last season, as well as adding some experienced players, who have not played at his level before.

Off the pitch, we have agreed a new a sponsorship deal with Toolroom Records whose owner, the DJ Mark Knight, has joined the Board of Directors along with local businessman Ben Dhesi. Luxury car dealership, Beck Evans, have also come on board as major sponsors. We wish all teams and players a safe season and hope that 2020/21 reaches a conclusion in these difficult times.

BY CAR

Head away from London on the A2 as far as the Black Prince Junction (Signposted for Crayford and Bexleyheath). At the roundabout, take the first exit to head up Gravel Hill towards Bexleyheath town centre.

When you get to the town centre, head straight across two small roundabouts to continue north towards Erith. Stay straight, passing a bus garage, then take the second exit at the next roundabout to continue straight.

As the road begins to dip down past a local hospital, take the first exit at the roundabout to carry on towards Erith (Erith Road). Head straight over the next roundabout, then turn right at the end of the shops to join Avenue Road.

Follow Avenue Road right towards the very end where you will find the entrance to the Stadium Car Park, which is signposted using a brown leisure centre sign and a blue cycle path sign, both pointing to the right.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The closest Station is Erith which is served by Thameslink and Southeastern services from Blackfriars, Charing Cross and London Bridge.

When you arrive at Erith, leave the station via the main exit, then walk up to the main road. Turn right to join the main, and continue (after passing across the busy roundabout) to follow the main road. When you arrive at a traffic light junction, there will be a McDonalds on the opposite side of the road. Turn right here to cross over the railway line, then continue past a few houses. You will then see the entrance to the ground on your left.

Please remember, as this is a midweek fixture, please check for delays or disruption before you travel and allow a little extra time to complete your journey where possible!

After a couple of nights of rest, I was raring to go tonight to keep up my efforts of seeing a game in every round of this season's F.A. Cup, and tonight's game of choice was a local derby between my beloved Cray Wanderers and Fisher at Hayes Lane – my local ground which I had not visited for a round 8 months prior to tonight due to ground hopping and COVID-19! With a lot of people I know supporting Fisher, I was the odd one out of the group tonight cheering on my local club of Cray Wanderers!

Having watched Fisher put in an excellent defensive shift at Crowborough in their Southern Counties East Football League Premier Division opener, as well as know that they had already knocked out higher league opposition in Tooting & Mitcham United in the prior round, I knew that Cray (of the Isthmian League Premier Division, so 2 leagues higher than Fisher) would be in for a tough test and a test they would need to take seriously. Cray Wanderers manager Tony Russell clearly had the same thoughts as myself as he went with a full strength team for the occasion.

It felt great to be back at Hayes Lane (albeit with constant rain falling all night) and Cray started the better of the two teams. Joe Taylor would go close in the 12th minute when he was played through beyond Fisher's defensive line but he blasted his shot wide of Fisher's goal.

However, a couple of minutes later, Cray took the lead when Jason Banton cut in from the left flank and produced a world class curling shot from the edge of the box and into the top right hand corner, giving Daniel Carpanini absolutely no chance – a goal well worthy of being my 100th of the season. Fisher however responded brightly, and seemed to be helped when Bradley Pritchard went off injured for Cray, with Cray losing a bit of solidity in midfield. Fisher could have grabbed themselves an equaliser in the 27th minute when Wale Odedoyn was played in down the channel but Lewis Carey stood firm to tip his shot wide for a corner.

However, in the 33rd minute, Fisher did equalise when Malaki Coker curled the ball into the bottom right hand corner from the edge of the box and out of the reach of Cray goalkeeper Lewis Carey. Just a few minutes later, there was controversy. Fisher played a ball over the top and Cray goalkeeper Lewis Carey came rushing out of his goal area to try and win and clear the ball, and he handled the ball in the process. I immediately put my head in my hands thinking he was bound to get sent off, but the referee gave him a yellow card instead, judging that Charlie Allen was in a position to cover the situation and that there therefore was not a clear goal scoring opportunity, which I thought was a lucky decision for Cray to say the least!

Cray took the lead on the stroke of half time when Charlie Allen unleashed a 30 yard pile driver of a shot to which Daniel Carpanini could only palm into the path of Freddie Parker, who made no mistake and had an easy tap in.

HT: 2-1.

Fisher started the second half brightly and had a good 15 minute passage of play to open up the half – a passage in which both Jacob Katonia and Trey Small would both have shots from similar positions straight at Lewis Carey from the edge of the box. In the 63rd minute, Cray doubled their lead to 3-1 when Jason Banton had the ball played to him and he took on the Fisher defender and produced a low shot from just inside the box which went into the bottom left corner and all but sealed the tie. Fisher however did not lie down and continued to give it a go. They were extremely unlucky not to score in the 67th minute when Malaki Coker had a shot from the edge of the box to which Lewis Carey got a magnificent finger tip to the ball to tip the ball onto the post. Fisher also had another guilt edge chance in the 86th minute when Wale Odedoyn broke down the right and squared the ball across the six yard box to Jack Gibbons but he spurned the chance and fired the ball wide and off target when it looked easier to score.

Anytime you play a Corinthian side you have to match their work rate, endeavour and battling qualities. Before you even put two passes together you had better get your sleeves rolled up and win your personal battles.

Fisher I thought had a real chance here yesterday after some impressive recent performances. I was further encouraged when Corinthian had some important players missing.

The opening exchanges were pretty frenetic and the opening goal only took 8 minutes to come. It went to the home side through Oloyede who beat Luke Thomas far too easily on the inside before firing past Carpanini low to his right. 1-0

Three minutes later and Fisher get back on terms through a fine team move that involved Fitzgerald Thomas Coker. An Udo cut back that Coker dispatched past Prall in the Corinthian goal. 1-1

Oloyede once again dribbled down the left touchline before once again cutting in on his right foot and his effort goes high and wide.

Fisher begin to build up a head of steam and several chances come and go. Fitzgerald heads a Yila corner wide and Coker flashes a cross across goal after Brown put him through with a neat pass.

Jamie Yila who gave the Corinthians 2 an absolute roasting on the day beat him with ease and he cut the ball back to Udo who was well placed. But his effort was well over the bar.

Jacob Katonia picked up a booking for a lunge on the Corinthian 10.

With 10 minutes to go until halftime Fisher looked in the ascendency. But like I said you can't get complacent or let your work rate drop. A slight mix up on the back four as they had their arms in the air calling for offside. Louie Clarke running from deep burst through the middle and fires his effort low to Carpanini's left to restore the Corinthian lead. 2-1 Had I had a bet on this game it would have been a tenner on Clarke anytime!

Two minutes later it was 3-1 after Fisher failed to deal with a corner and through a crowd Oloyede pokes home to increase the lead. 3-1

Fisher go in two goals behind when they had played well. HT 3-1

If Fisher were to get anything from this game they needed an early goal.

An early corner forced Prall to push the ball over his crossbar. Corinthian have half a chance down the other end when a free kick is headed over.

After fine work by Katonia and De Mata in midfield the ball is fed to Yila on the left and he beat the full back and pulled the ball back into the path of the onrushing Udo who sidefoots home to reduce the arrears. 3-2

Coker gets away down the right and his cross is over hit but Yila recovers the ball and once more torments the full back winning another corner.

De Mata is also booked for a foul in midfield. Katonia earns a corner for Fisher after a mazy dribble and shot. The corner comes out to De Mata and his effort is high wide and handsome! Yila once again opens his box of magic tricks after a fine ball down the line from Peter Ojemen. It was about this stage of the game where I would say the Corinthian game management was better than Fishers. Niggly fouls slowed the game down and Fisher started to look frustrated. It was also at this stage that a few handbags were thrown about as Carpanini needed lengthy treatment after a heavy challenge.

The Corinthian 6 and 4 are booked in quick succession as Fisher make use of the subs bench. One more chance for Fisher as Jamie Yila heads over from a corner when inside the six yard box. With four minutes left on the clock Housego made sure that all three points went to the home side as he tucked away his shot after a Square ball across the six yard box.

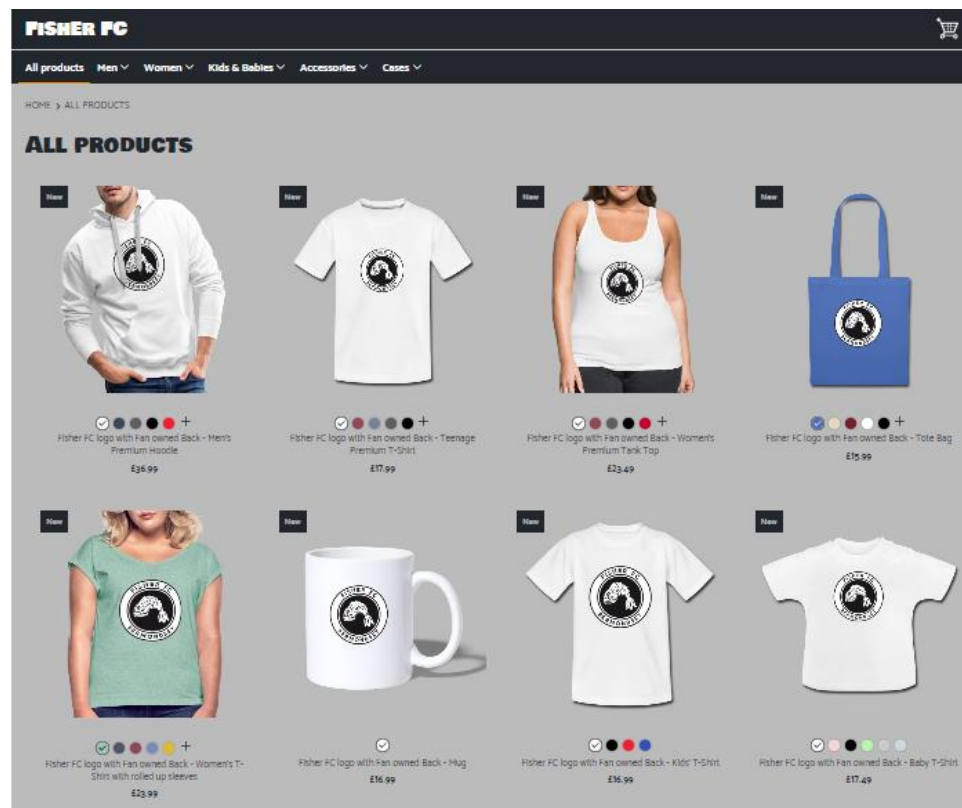
