







BY CAR

Follow the A20 out of town as far as Swanley, then exit at the junction with the M25 (as the A20 becomes M20). At the roundabout take the third exit to join the A20 towards West Kingsdown and Brands Hatch Race Circuit.

Follow the A20, passing over two roundabouts (taking the second exit on both), to proceed towards Brands Hatch.

Turn left on to Scratchers Lane, then after the bend turn left again (at the second junction) to join the northbound Brands Hatch Road (which will pass under the M20 as you join the road).

Follow Brands Hatch Road as it becomes Valley Road. Stay with Valley Road, passing Fawkham Manor Hospital on the right, and proceed until you find a green sign for Corinthian Sports Club & Golf Course on the right.

Turn into the driveway and followit to the car park, which is between the Clubhouse and the ground.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Longfield is the closest Station to Corinthian Sports Club and can be reached on Southeastern train services from London Victoria. You can also reach Longfield from Dartford (for those needing to travel from Charing Cross or Canon Street Line stations). Arriva service 423 will get you from Dartford to Longfield, while a 96 from Woolwich to Bluewater coupled with a Go-Coach 474/475 service will get you there (although will take a little longer). Please note, all buses will drop off at Longfield Station.

We recommend using a local taxi company to complete the journey, cabs can normally be found outside the main entrance to the station. Contact details for local cab companies can be found at the Station or in the nearby Waitrose Supermarket.

The fare is approx. £7 in each direction from the station to the ground.

Little Common Football Club formed originally as Albion United in 1966, when Ken Cherry had a vision for youth football in the area. Initially two youth teams were formed one at Under 16 level and one at Under 14 level. However, the two teams grew like topsy and today the club runs sixteen youth and four senior teams.

Albion United started life in the Hastings League and was very soon running two sides instead of the planned one and they moved to the East Sussex league. That league held no bounds for the highly successful United sides and after the double winning success of the 1977/78 season the club successfully applied to join the Sussex County League Division Two.

In 1974 the club committee decided to provide the club with its own club house and changing rooms, to include showers and a bar after spending eight years on grounds which did not have such facilities. The club obtained two prefabricated houses which were built in Fulham at the end of the Second World War. They cost £250 each and the necessary planning permissions were given. The club erected these two buildings, joined together, to make one large building; half was changing rooms, showers and toilets and the other half lounge and bar.

This became the clubs home on entry to the Sussex County League and their first season saw them finish in the top five and they reached the Division 2 Cup Final only to be beaten by Crowborough Athletic. Subsequent seasons saw the club occupy a mid to lower position in the table, actually finishing bottom in 1980/81 and 1981/82 (Division Three was not formed until 1983). Albion enjoyed their best placing since entering the League when they finished 6th in 1985/86 and changed their name to Little Common Albion at the end of that season.

The newly named club again finished in 6th place the next two seasons, before their fortunes began to slump once again. In 1993/94 they were relegated after finishing bottom; and left the League altogether after finishing 15th of 16 in Division Three the following season. The 1990s proved a difficult period for the club and they re-joined the East Sussex League. A third consecutive relegation was a huge blow for the club and in the space of just three seasons they had gone from playing senior football to junior football.

The club committee decided that in order for the club to progress further new facilities were required in order to attract and retain players. Buoyed on by a thriving youth policy the club began its rebuilding process. The club joined together with the local council and cricket club in order to develop a project to build a new sports pavilion. After many years of hard work by all involved the project finally began to get moving and in 1999 a £262,000 Sport England Lottery Grant was awarded for the project. Building finally began in 2001 and the club moved into its new home in November 2002.



On the pitch the clubs fortunes continued to fluctuate, a successful 1998/99 season saw Common just miss out on promotion to Seaford before being relegated the following season. A rise followed with an instant return to the Premier Division and after avoiding relegation on the final day of the 2003/04 season the club committee decided to make a concerted effort the following season to realize its ambition of a return to the Sussex County League.

After spending ten seasons in the East Sussex League, the club were successfully crowned Premier Division champions in the 2004/05 season and applied for a return to the County League. After carrying out the essential work to their ground to achieve promotion the club was successful in its application.

After spending four seasons in Division 3 the club was promoted to Division 2 at the end of the 2008/09 season after clinching the second promotion spot on the final day of the season against Bosham.

The club went on to record a 4th place finish in the 2009/10 season before a midtable finish in 2010/11. The 2011/12 season saw a change in management after a disappointing start to the campaign, Russell Eldridge returned to the club and a win on the final weekend of the season saw Common finish outside of the relegation zone.

The 2012/13 season saw the club finish 3rd but ground grading regulations prevented the club from being promoted. At the beginning of 2016 the club lost its founder and chairman, Ken Cherry, fifty years after forming the club.

The 2016/17 season saw Common finish runners-up to Saltdean United and their highest ever league placing, once again ground grading regulations prevented them from being promoted to the Premier Division and a ground share agreement was secured with Eastbourne United for the 2017/18 season.

The Commoners went on to claim the Division One League and Cup double in the 2017/18 season to seal a place in the Premier Division for first time in the club's history.

Despite a tough season the Commoners enjoyed a good end to the 2018/19 season to finish outside of the relegation places and secure another season in the premier division.



Cray Wanderers FC Bromley Football Club Hayes Lane Bromley **BR2 9EF**

Hayes Lane is situated between the A21 London to Hastings Road and the A232 Croydon to Orpington Road. You are advised to avoid heavy congestion in Bromley Town Centre. However, there is a 7ft width barrier from the A21 road in Hayes Lane so coaches should not approach from this direction.

FOR VISITORS ARRIVING FROM THE CROYDON/SURREY AREAS

From the A232, turn left into Baston Road (B265), following it for about two miles as it becomes Hayes Street and then Hayes Lane. Cray Wanderers FC is on the right hand side of the road, just after the mini roundabout.

FOR VISITORS ARRIVING FROM NORTH AND EAST LONDON

Head away from London using the A21 through Lewisham, Catford and Bromley. When you get to Bromley, head south past the town centre Kentish Way, then bare left at the traffic lights to join Masons Hill.

At the next Traffic Light junction, turn right on to Hayes Lane. Follow Hayes Lane, go through the width restriction barrier, then the entrance to the ground can be found on the left (second left, signposted for Bromley FC).

FOR VISITORS ARRIVING BY TRAIN

The nearest railway station to the ground is Bromley South, which is serviced by trains from London Victoria and the south-east coast. Trains run regularly up until about 23:30 midweek and usually later at weekends. There are also about two services an hour from London Blackfriars. If your train into London goes via East Croydon, it may be easier to get off there and catch the 119 bus to the ground (approximate journey time is around 40 minutes).

FOR VISITORS ARRIVING ON FOOT (FROM BROMLEY SOUTH STATION)

Turn left out of the station and then right shortly afterwards into Westmoreland Road, at the traffic lights by the T-junction near the Police Station and the Churchill building. Turn left after the church, into Hayes Road. Take care to follow the road when it bears round to the left rather than ending up in Cameron Road. At the end of Hayes Road turn right into Hayes Lane, having first crossed Hayes Lane using the traffic island near the mini roundabout. The entrance to the ground is about 200m on your left.

FOR VISITORS ARRIVING BY BUS

The 119 (Bromley to Croydon), 146 (Bromley to Downe) and the 314 (Eltham to New Addington) all go past the ground.


