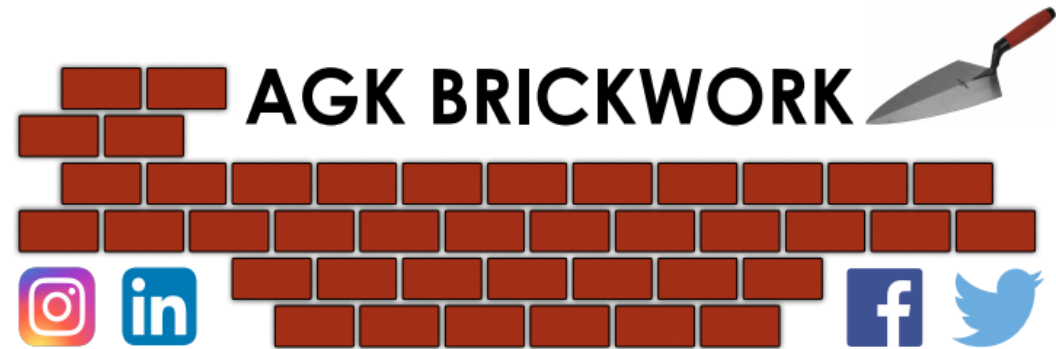

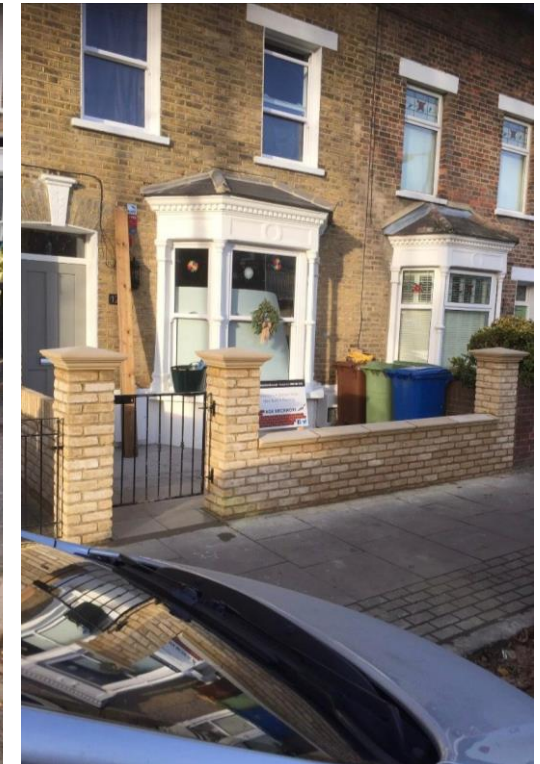

Fisher FC 2020/21 season tickets are now available, with a £10 discount (half your membership fee back!) for Fisher members

We have set season ticket prices at the same level as last year at £100 for adults and £60 for concessions (before the £10 deduction for members). With two extra sides in the league this year (Balham and Tower Hamlets) this covers 20 home league games so is giving football for a fiver!

Purchasing a season ticket will support the club in more ways than just financially as it will ease the logistics of match day admittance where we are going to have to record the names and addresses of all those in attendance and reduce the burden on the gate of handling card payments at the same time as we move to cashless entry. We would urge as many members and supporters to consider supporting the club in this manner.

Adults and concession members get a £10 rebate on their season ticket, meaning that your membership –and share of ownership of the club – is half price if you become a season ticket holder.

In addition to this, under 16s season cards are now completely free if bought in conjunction with an adult or senior season card.

Proof of status is required for concession purchases. Please note that season tickets allow access to home Southern Counties East Football League fixtures only. They are not valid for any cup fixtures (inclusive of League Cup fixtures).

Up until July 2013 the club was playing under the name Bethnal Green United. The club was established in 2000 by Mohammed Nurul Hoque and Akhtar Ahmed as a community club. The club played in several leagues, including the Canary Wharf Summer League, the Inner London Football League and the London Intermediate League, before joining the Middlesex County League. We were granted Senior status after winning the league's Premier Division in 2009, and were promoted to the Essex Senior League. In the 2009–10 season we finished fifth in the ESL and won both cups operated by the Essex Senior League, beating Burnham Ramblers 4–1 in the final of the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy.

When this fixture came out of the hat in the middle of August it looked to have all the ingredients for a classic cup tie. 2 South London rivals, with excellent vocal support, fresh young talent and a cracking meeting (Which Tooting won 5-2) last season to boot. It's fair to say it didn't disappoint.

The game began with both sides very much feeling each other out, both midfielders were very busy in the opening 15 minutes. Tooting winger Abdel Sahnoun looking lively and the most likely to carve out a chance but he got little change out of Fisher's Luke Thomas despite his array of tricks and flicks.

The games first real chance fell to the hosts after 18 minutes, a free kick, central & 20 yards out. Daryl Coleman stepped up but the Fisher wall stood firm and deflected it behind for a corner from the right hand side. This corner came to nothing and was well cleared.

Fisher's first real look at the opposition goal came soon after a free kick on halfway was swung in and met and headed wide by Peter Ojemen who was impressive throughout.

An even better chance came & went when Fisher broke with Jacob Katonia and he found Jamie Yilla who beat 2 defenders skilfully before sashaying past a third and then picking out the unmarked Christian Udo who headed over. An effort he probably could have done better with.

The hosts then took the lead on 29 minutes, a ball towards the corner flag was pulled back from the byline by Malaki Coker for a throw in, however the assistant on the far side signalled a corner. From the corner, the ball was won by Sam Fitzgerald who headed away but the second ball fell to Tooting's Christie Sinn Kaye whose header just about found the back of the net despite the attentions of Rob Brown. Fisher a goal down, harshly so.

The home side nearly doubled the lead soon after a ferocious Coleman free kick was too hot for Carpanini who spilled his effort into the path of the on rushing Sinn Kaye but the Fisher custodian atoned for this by pushing away the ball to safety at second attempt.

Fisher restored parity soon after, Rob Brown picked up the ball and slipped in Coker excellently, he made his way up the pitch, riding a couple of challenges & doggedly getting possession back when tackled. He strode into the box and fired a shot that was deflected into the path of Christian Udo & his touch helped the ball away into the far corner for a deserved equaliser. Nothing more than he deserved as he was tireless throughout.

Fisher were now into their stride with the front 4 of Yila, Brown, Udo & Coker causing all sorts of issues. Yila got free down the left hand side and found himself 1 on 1 but to be fair to Gary Ross in goal narrowed the angle and made an excellent save with his shins and got the ball away for a corner.

HT 1-1

The opening 15 minutes of the second half followed the pattern of the first with both sides feeling their way back into the game and the ball spending a lot of the time in midfield.

Fisher thought they'd taken the lead in the tie just after the hour mark, Gary Ross & Malaki Coker going up for a lofted ball together which the keeper fumbled leaving Coker with the simplest of tap ins. However, the ref blew for the foul on the keeper. Certainly a marginal decision, which looked harsh in real time.

Tooting retook the lead on 79 minutes when the ball pinged around at a corner and fell eventually to Dontai Stewart who placed an excellent effort into the far corner through a crowd of players. A great finish & Tooting back in front with just over 10 minutes to play.

Fisher to be fair didn't let their heads drop and went at Tooting & Mitcham again. Jamie Yilla picked up the ball and began driving at his full back, he skipped round his man and invited the challenge from Dean Hamlin who chopped him down and the referee immediately pointed for a spot kick. A stonewall penalty.

After a period during which Tooting's keeper was booked, Josh Biddlecombe stepped up and smashed the ball coolly down the middle of the goal and into the roof of the net despite Gary Ross getting a glove on it. 2-2 with 5 minutes remaining.

Fisher looked more likely to win the game but their attacks were well suppressed by their opponents from the Isthmian South Central. Tooting's only chance after this came from a free kick out wide on the right, which was preceded by a 21 man pushing & shoving match. The free kick went in and was well cleared before the ref blew for a foul on Sam Fitzgerald.

Fisher opened the gates to all comers last night. And the turnout was decent with 134 coming through the turnstiles.

AJ made three changes from Saturdays 0-0 draw with Crowborough. Out went Brown, Gibbons and Katonia due to suspension. In came Lockwood to skipper the side with Rocha and Ibrahim.

The first action of the game came in the 6th minute when Balham were awarded a penalty for handball. It was one of those pens that can go either way. Happy if you get it, fuming if it's given against you.

Up stepped Tom Read who made no mistake dispatching his effort low into Carpanini's right hand corner. 0-1 Fisher won a free kick out to the right

When Ibrahim was fouled. The free kick was floated in and the Balham keeper Read drops the ball but gets away with it. (Are the keeper and number 11 brothers?)

To be brutally honest Balham dominated the opening 15 minutes. A big side that knocked it around well. And we're not afraid to put a foot in and get in Fisher faces.

I was particularly impressed with the Balham right winger James Adebayo who gave Sarpong a tough night.

Adebayo is a big strong lad who doesn't mind putting it about. He's also got a turn of pace and tricky feet. Put all that together and you have a real handful.

Fisher struggled to get into any rhythm. Careless passes and passes not played into each other with enough quality saw the ball return to Balham time and again. You could sense that it was going to be one of those evenings.

In the 26th minute Ibrahim wins a free kick about 25 yards from goal. Rocha steps up beats Read all ends up only for his effort to canon back off the bar into the path of Yila who side foots wide with the goal wide open.

Two minutes later Balham's Adebayo makes a powerful run from inside his own half dribbling past a couple of players only to be stopped by Luke Thomas who concedes a corner.

Carpanini claims the cross from the resultant corner and duly screams at his team mates to liven up.

Next up for the Adebayo experience is De Mata who takes a heavy challenge.

Moments later Read hits a dipping drive they Carpanini collects into his midriff.

As the ball breaks loose in midfield Lockwood puts the equaliser in on Adebayo and picks up a yellow card for his troubles.

35 minutes in Fisher still under the gun concede another corner after the big man Sam Fitzgerald clears from inside the six yard box. Balham's Erriu wins the header but Carps collects comfortably.

Two minutes later and Cameron Gordon gets himself between Fitzgerald and Thomas down the channel and his pace takes him away. He fires his effort into the side netting. And perhaps another let off for Fisher when Gordon's finish could have been better.

De Mata needed a lengthy treatment after taking a whack just before half time.

As the game went into stoppage time Thomas and Yila combined well down the right to force a couple of quick corners that didn't come to anything.

A half time switch by AJ saw Rocha replaced by Lemba saw Fisher go with two up top in a bid to get back into the game.

The opening 15 minutes of the half saw Fisher get a footing back into the game. A free kick from the left was fired in by Lockwood but it didn't have his usual quality on it. Read collects with ease and this was going to be the story of the remainder of the match. Read collecting corners and free kicks without being under any real pressure as Fishers final ball/pass was not good enough on the night.

Balham now feeling under a bit of pressure remained well organised throughout and they look a side that are going to be well suited to the Scef1 premier.

Balham's right back Julian Fuller had a very good night marking Jamie Yila out of the game. Yila was eventually replaced by Gibbons who also didn't get much change from Fuller.

Yila can't be a 10/10 every game, every player knows if they have played well or not. Jamie can't do it all of his own. And he also didn't receive much in the way of service last night.

Fisher are now fully in the ascendancy but whatever they tried fizzled out.

Corner after corner wasted and another cross from Lockwood that looked like it was heading towards Lemba was plucked out the air from Read.

A frustrating evening was also had by Biddlecombe who's only poke at goal was deflected behind when fired in from around the penalty spot. The corner you guessed it came to nothing again.

Biddlecombe makes way for Main and he makes himself busy getting in amongst it in his short cameo appearance.

As the game went into the usual 4 minutes injury time Fisher forced another couple of corners that came to nothing. Balham held on for all three points and have made a very good start to life in the SCEFL.

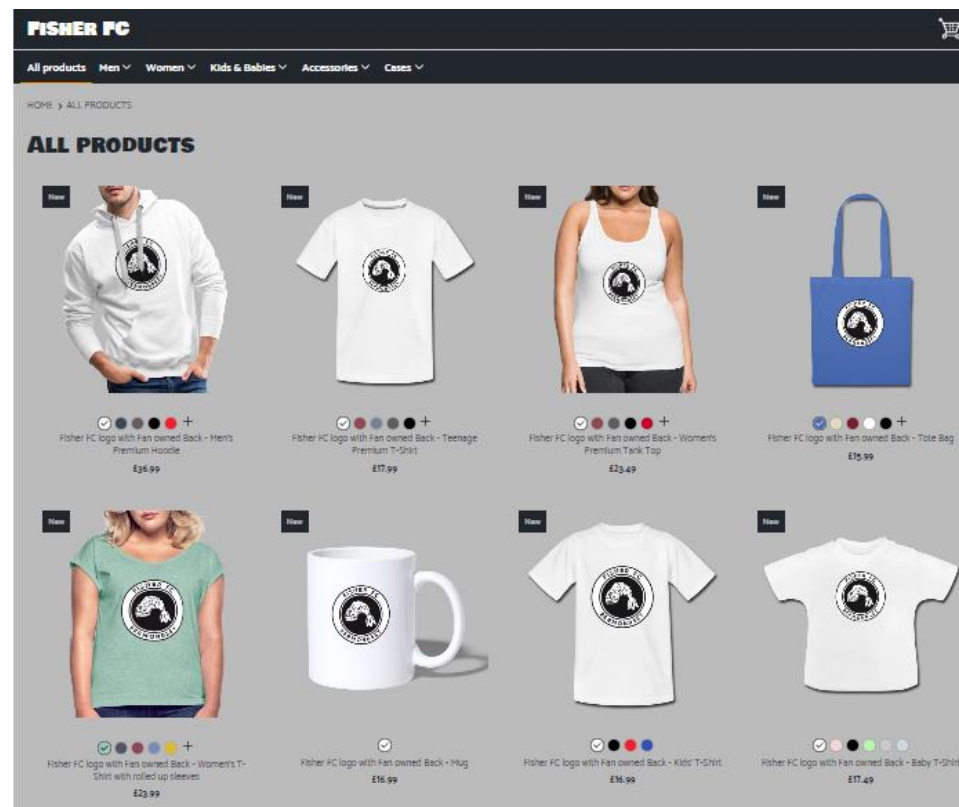

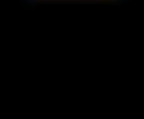
