








Fisher FC 2020/21 season tickets are now available, with a £10 discount (half your membership fee back!) for Fisher members

We have set season ticket prices at the same level as last year at £100 for adults and £60 for concessions (before the £10 deduction for members). With two extra sides in the league this year (Balham and Tower Hamlets) this covers 20 home league games so is giving football for a fiver!

Purchasing a season ticket will support the club in more ways than just financially as it will ease the logistics of match day admittance where we are going to have to record the names and addresses of all those in attendance and reduce the burden on the gate of handling card payments at the same time as we move to cashless entry. We would urge as many members and supporters to consider supporting the club in this manner.

Adults and concession members get a £10 rebate on their season ticket, meaning that your membership – and share of ownership of the club – is half price if you become a season ticket holder.

In addition to this, under 16s season cards are now completely free if bought in conjunction with an adult or senior season card.

You can pay online from our Season Tickets page, which can be found at using this web address http://www.fisherfc.org/season-tickets/ or you can pay using Bank or Credit Card or Cash at any home fixture.

Proof of status is required for concession purchases. Please note that season tickets allow access to home Southern Counties East Football League fixtures only. They are not valid for any cup fixtures (inclusive of League Cup fixtures).

2020-21 SEASON TICKETS

A good test for The Fish with a trip to Metrogas to play SCEFL 1 side Stansfeld, in their last preseason friendly prior to the return of competitive football on Tuesday.

Fisher began quickly and won a free kick 25 yards from goal inside the opening minute of the game. The free kick was well blocked and cleared.

Stansfeld had the next chance of note, Ollie Milton having a decent chance saved inside the opening 5 minutes. This set the tone for the game going forward, end to end, blood and thunder. Something which both management teams will have wanted going into the season, in order to get match sharp. Jamie Yilla followed up Wednesday's excellent performance against Sutton Athletic by picking up where he left off and making his markers life difficult. He twisted and turned on the byline before teeing up Martin Sarpong. His low ball a cross the six yard box, just missing the far post. A warning shot a cross the bow for Stansfeld.

Fisher continued to press, Josh Biddlecombe was particularly busy both in and out of possession, combining well with Yilla, after the latter had kept the ball on the pitch against the odds. He was hars hly denied what looked a stonewall penalty when he was chopped down after releasing the ball to the right winger. The referee did blow, for a dive. One amongst a number of strange decisions. Fisher were ahead 90 seconds or so after this though. A free kick on the left hand edge of the penalty area was played to Jamie Yilla who cut to the byline and sent the ball towards the front post where it was stabbed in by the industrious Biddlecombe. No less than The Fish deserved on the opening half hours play.

They would have gone even further a head shortly after, but for an excellent save by Charlie Cottrell in the Stansfeld goal. Biddlecombe was played through and looked to have found the top corner but Cottrell denied him at full stretch.

Stansfeld did have one good chance to hit back as the half wore on, Ryan Hassan forcing a good save down to his right out of Dan Carpanini in the Fish goal.

Sam Fitzgerald's hould have made it 2-0 on the strike of halftime. A delivery from the right hand side was met by the towering centre half whose's hot was excellently turned on to the crossbar & a way for another corner.

HT 1-0 Fish – could and perhaps should have been more.

The first chance of the second period fell to Stansfeld, Ollie Milton heading wide from a decent position. Stansfeld began the half well to be fair and Fisher did have to do some defending, with a couple of counter attacks being dealt with well.

How Fisher didn't score on the hour after recycling one of these situations is a mystery. Sam Fitzgerald picked the ball up and sprayed a great ball down the left hand side to Jamie Yilla with the outside of his boot, Yilla then cut inside and put a great ball across the 6 yard box. Nobody got on the end of this. The move didn't break down and the ball came back to Yilla who then struck the outside of the post. The ball then fell to Harry Main who was only denied by an excellent goal line clearance. The game began to fade away scoring opportunities wise as the substitutions mounted up and the ball stayed more in midfield. That's not to say it wasn't competitive with the challenges flying in. There was one more chance with Harry Main playing a cute ball round the corner to Malachi Coker whose shot was turned round the post.

Horsham YMCA Football Club was formed in 1898. During the first 31 years of the club's existence they played at Lyons Field, the name of which is derived from the Bowes-Lyons family who owned a substantial amount of land around Horsham at one time.

In 1929 the club moved to its present ground at Gorings Mead for which they were able to secure the freehold at a later date. In the early years 'YM' played in the Horsham District League before moving to the Crawley League and subsequently to the Mid Sussex League. Their rise through the later two leagues was swift and facilitated the club's entry into the Sussex County League in 1959.

In that first season, YM finished twelfth out of fifteen teams and then began a gradual improvement. They spent seven years in Division 2 before gaining promotion in 1966 as Champions, two points ahead of Newhaven. During that season they dropped just four points from 34 matches, scoring 141 goals in the process - a superb performance. The dub gained Division 1 status along with Newhaven and remained there for sixteen seasons until the end of the 1981-82 season, when unfortunately they were relegated. The best performances during that period were two consecutive third place finishes in 1977-78 and 1978-79.

Despite relegation, the club bounced straight back as Division 2 champions in the following season. 1979-80 1st Team SquadThis time, YM spent five seasons in the top division before being relegated for the second time at the end of the 1987-88 season. Promotion back to Division 1 for the third time was achieved by finishing third in 1994-95. The past six seasons have seen YM consolidate their Division 1 status by finishing twelth, eighth, thirteenth, a very creditable third in our Centenary Season and fifth in the last two seasons. During the past two seasons, all of YM's previous achievements were put into the shade and despite their league positions being disappointing, this was probably due to the enormous number of cup matches played. 1999-00 1st Team Squad

In the 1999-00 season, YM had their best ever results in both the FA Cup and the FA Vase, and it was only dubious decisions by match officials that halted progress in both competitions. In their FA Cup Fourth Qualifying Round tie at home to Chelmsford City, the winning goal was scored by a player who was so far offside, the lines man probably did not notice him before it was too late, whilst in their Fourth Round FA Vase tie away at AFC Totton, a dubious penalty late in the second half ended YM's dreams of reaching Wembley. During that season the club also reached the semi-finals of the Sussex Senior Cup, losing a close fought tie to Hastings Town, but beating near neighbours and 'friends over the fence' Horsham FC 4-0 in a Third Round home tie in front of over 400 spectators.

In September 1999 the dub's attendance record was smashed when a crowd of over 940 people crammed into 'The Mead' for the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup against Chelmsford City.

During the 2000-01 season, YM graciously bowed out of the FA Cup at Whyteleafe, and at Cowes Sports in the FA Vase, but reached the semi-finals of the Sussex Senior Cup before losing to Bognor Regis. Despite these three cup defeats, YM did manage to add some silverware to their trophy cabinet by winning the Sussex RUR Cup, with an emphatic 3-0 victory over Burgess Hill Town, whilst the Reserve Team achieved a League and Cup double. A rather disappointing 2001-02 season saw a mid-table league finish but a nother piece of silverware brought back to the Mead, courtesy of an excellent 2-0 Good Friday defeat of Ringmer in the John O'Hara Cup Final at Wick.

The 2002-03 season saw the re-establishment of a Youth side at YM, with the aim being to grow new players over the following few years in order to participate in the senior teams. YM cruised high in the league all season, recording a record 22-1 victory over Littlehampton Town, before finally being pipped into third position at the end of the season. The Reserves finished mid-table and the new Youth team finished second in Division One of the Arun & Chichester League, losing out only on goal difference, although they beat the League Champions 1-0 in the League Cup.

2003-04 1st Team Squad Despite slightly increased attendances, YM's thirteenth placed finish the following season was disappointing by comparison, and few were prepared for the improvement shown in 2004-05 that saw John Suter's side bring the League title to Goring's Mead for the first time. Having looked in an unassailable position for most of the campaign, there were a few wobbles in the final months, but fortunately the team recovered to ultimately romp home fifteen points clear of runners-up Rye & Iden United.

The season was tinged with disappointment when Gorings Mead failed grading requirements for entry into the Isthmian League, and many pundits wondered whether YM might have missed the boat.



With YM trailing Ringmer by twelve points as the 2005-06 season reached its climax, and struggling to find the money for the required work on the ground, it looked like that might have been it for YM. But remarkably, however, the players maintained their resolve as their rivals buckled, and YM not only over-turned the deficit, but romped home by nine points to a chieve back-to-back League titles.

A number of changes on and off the field. Manager of nineteen years, John Suter, left the club, as did most of the players. John was quickly replaced by the very capable Chris White, who built a new YM team from scratch and steered them to promotion back into the Ryman League at the end of his first season in charge.

Gorings Mead was deemed fit by FA inspectors to allow the club to take its place in the newly created Isthmian Division One South for the 2006-07 season, completing a fantastic year for the town, with neighbours Horsham also winning promotion to the Premier Division.

After competing for two seasons in Division One South, the club finished second from bottom in the 2007-08 season and were relegated backto Sussex County League Division One.

Returning to the County League saw YM go through Returning to the County League saw YM go through a number of changes on and off the field. Manager of nineteen years, John Suter, left the club, as did most of the players. John was quickly replaced by the very capable Chris White, who built a new YM team from scratch and steered them to promotion back into the Ryman League at the end of his first season in charge.

The 2009-10 season saw a nother change at Gorings Mead, with YM becoming landlords of former neighbours, Horsham FC. This highlighted the challenges of ground shares a cross the country, but both teams did well, YM achieving eleventh place and their highest ever points total in the Ryman League. Sadly, at the end of the season Chris White left the club for Worthing.

The following two seasons saw the club in a state of flux, with a number of managers (Colin Jenkinson, John Cumberbatch and Sammy Donnelly) coming and going, and even more players doing the same. At the end of the 2011-12 season, Peter Buckland stepped in to steady the YM ship, saving the club from relegation by winning the last game of the season.

Buckland then built a squad for the 2012-13 season, which produced a very respectable mid-table finish. The nucleus of this same squad then pushed on in the 2013-14 season to be real promotion contenders - though finally losing out on that accolade thanks to an 89th minute Littlehampton Town winner on the final day of the season.

Nonetheless 2013-14 was an impressive season, with YM reaching the semi-finals of the Sussex Senior Cup and winning the RUR Cup on penalties in their final game of the season.

In comparison to 2013-14's fourth placed Sussex County League finish, RUR Charity Cup triumph and Sussex Senior Challenge Cup semi-final appearance, YM must view the 2014-15 campaign as a huge under achievement.

A 4-2 win over Chichester City on the final day of the season secured a respectable fifth placed Division 1 finish for Peter Buckland's side, but this was one spot lower and eight points worse off than the prior year, and with double the number of defeats. Perhaps even more disappointing was YM's poor record in the season's cup competitions, with runs in the FA Cup and FA Vase, Sussex Senior Cup, RUR Charity Cup and Peter Bentley League Challenge Cup all over by December.

2015-16 season saw the Sussex County Football League renamed the Southern Combination Football League and the top division renamed as the Premier Division. YM finished in fourth place in that season and in 10th position in 2016-17 season but with club not distinguishing itself in cup competitions in either campaign.

Non-league league restructuring meant that there were two promotion places a vailable for season 2017-18 and in a determined effort to gain promotion YM led the division for several months before falling away to a fourth place finish.

However, significant progress was made in cup competitions as YM bowed out of the FA at the 1st round stage away at the eventual Vase winners Thatcham Town. The club also reached the final of the Peter Bentley League Challenge Cup for the first time in many years. However, YM were defeated by league champions Haywards Heath Town.

CROWBOROUGH COMMUNITY STADIUM FERMOR ROAD, CROWBOROUGH, TN6 3AN

Head out of London either via the A21 or A2. Join the M25 and head south, joining the A21 at junction 5 to head south towards Tonbridge.

Exit the A21 at the junction for Southborough (A26), and take the A26 towards Tunbridge Wells. Head through Tunbridge Wells, staying with the A26 and head south away from the town towards Crowborough.

Turn off the A26 into Sheep Plain which meanders into Hurtis Hill. At the mini roundabout go straight into Fermor Road, take the second turning on the right into and then immediately turn right into the Alderbrook Recreation Ground.

By Public Transport

There two options for those heading down by train. You can either go directly to Crowborough from Victoria (Calling at East Croydon if you want to avoid Central London and save a little bit of money). Crowborough Station is approximately a 20 minute walk from the Stadium. Please note the walk does suit those with any walking difficulties as footpaths have a habit of either disappearing or becoming narrow dirt tracks.

Option 2 is to head for Tunbridge Wells by train and then pick up a Brighton Bound bus service 29. Ask for a return to Rose Court.

When you get off the bus, walk down the hill to the roundabout, then turn left on to Fermor Road. Follow the road to the second turning on the right and you will find the entrance to the ground just around the corner.




