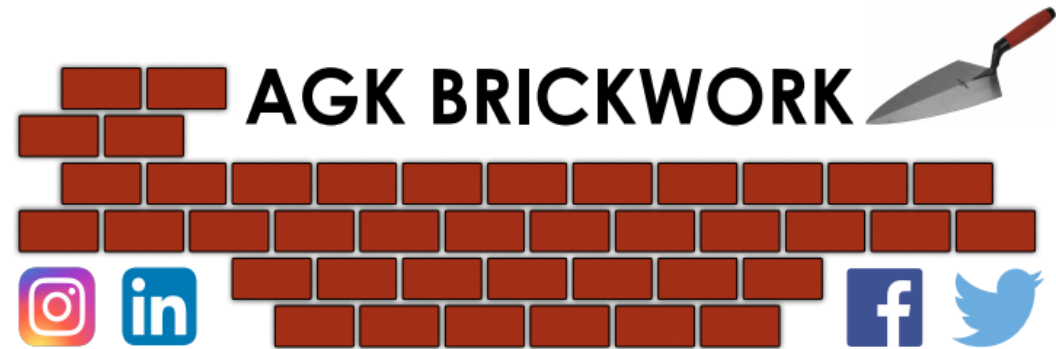

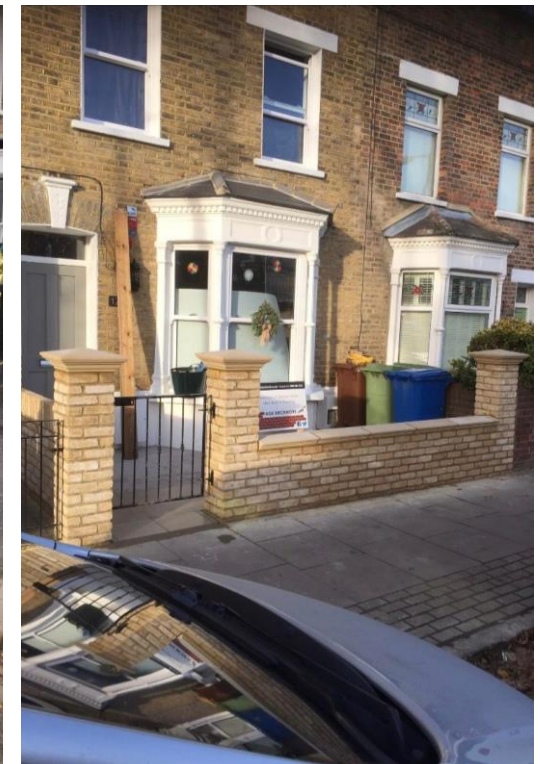

A frantic ending saw Fisher claim all three points in a n exciting South London derby against AFC Croydon Athletic with Rob Brown's injury time penalty finally seeing the Fish home in a game they had been cruising through ten minutes earlier.

Fisher had made an excellent start to game with Tarik Ibrahim slotting home from inside the six-yard box after Luke Thomas had flicked the ball through to him following some early Fisher pressure. The visitors looked to build on this start and several through balls almost released the front three of Ibrahim, Udo and Yila on numerous occasions before a scrambling tackle thwarted the route to goal. When Ibrahim did escape on the right his low cross saw Udo tumble under pressure from the centre back just as he looked to turn the ball home. The referee turned away the appeals for a penalty in what was a tough call to make either way.

Good work from Yila on the left saw a number of dangerous balls into the box punched and parried by the home custodian and from one half cleared cross Julio Da Mata miscued when trying to force home the rebound in what was the clearest chance of the half for Fisher to extend the lead.

Half time came with Carpanini relatively untroubled in the Fisher goal and despite more attacking intent from AFC Croydon in the early exchanges of the second spell his goal did not seem under any undue threat. With the foul count going up for both sides the game became scrappier and started to look as if a single goal might be the decider.

All this changed in the last twenty minutes commencing with the hosts playing for ten minutes with ten men after a sin binning offence. Having already received a yellow card for an earlier foul the player headed first for the tunnel assuming a second yellow meant a red only to be called back by the referee to be redirected to the sin bin amidst much confusion. A series of fouls lead to further bafflement by the benches around decisions and following what appeared to be a caution for the home bench a comment from the Fisher dugout saw substitute goalkeeper Charlie Payne dismissed.

A period of Fisher pressure culminated with Da Mata's shot from distance forcing a scrambling save to turn the ball around the post and the resulting corners never being too comfortable dealt with eventually saw Fisher receive a free kick twenty yards out. Jamie Yila precisely struck the ball into the top corner with the keeper motionless to extend the lead and give all in the ground a feeling of the last fifteen minutes being a formality.

However, the return of Billy Murphy from the sin bin allowed him to take a rather oddly awarded free kick just outside the box with five minutes left on the clock and his dink over the wall squirmed in at the near post to give the hosts a lifeline. Within a minute the lifeline had enabled a full-blown rescue act as casual play from the Fish quickly coughed up possession and a series of missed tackles and sloppy clearances saw a low cross travel into the box and find Murphy again to tuck the ball home to level the game.

Fisher looked shell shocked having gone from a two-goal lead with five to play to suddenly being level and AFC Croydon sensed a total turnaround was on the card and pushed forward. Like a punch tiring heavyweight Fisher hung on grimly awaiting the bell and looked to weathered the storm and have settled for the point as the clock moved to the fourth minute of injury time. A final flighted diagonal ball saw substitute Harry Main spin off the shoulder of the defender and his speed off the mark saw him get to the ball and nod it over the onrushing keeper before being clattered to the ground for a stonewall penalty. Main required lengthy treatment from what subsequently turned out to be concussion and severe bruising following his hospital visit, but Rob Brown stayed calm in the delay and gleefully tucked away the penalty to give Fisher the three points much to the joy of the 35 travelling fans behind the goal.

The win moves Fisher up to 11th in the table prior to the visit of Deal Town to St Paul's on Saturday.

Deal Town FC were formed in 1921 taking over from the Deal Discharged Sailors and Soldiers FC who had replaced the Deal Cinque Ports FC in 1920. The Cinque Ports Club had been in existence since the early 1900s.

For the first 50 years or so of their existence the Hoops played at various times in the old Kent League or Kent Amateur League and in the 1950s they enjoyed one of their most successful periods, winning the Kent League title in 1954 and the Kent League Cup in 1958, when they beat Margate 3-0 in the final, before the KL was disbanded the following year.

Deal then become one of the founder members of the Aetolian League in 1959, where they finished runners-up in their first season, before leaving the AL to join the Southern League in 1963. But after enduring three torrid seasons in the SL Deal switched leagues again in 1966 when they joined the Greater London League.

Deal spent five seasons in the GLL, with the highlight coming in 1968 when they won the League Cup by beating East Ham Utd 2-1 after extra-time. But when the GLL merged with the Spartan League at the end of the 1970-71 season Deal's first team opted not to join the merged league and instead took over from their reserve side in the newly-reborn Kent League. The club's next trophy success came 11 years later when they won the Kent League Cup by defeating Erith & Belvedere in the 1982 final, but trophies again proved hard to come by in the ensuing years. That was all to change however after Roy Smith took over as chairman in 1997, and his ambitions both on and off the field quickly lifted the club. Smith appointed a full-time manager in Tommy Sampson for the beginning of the 1998-99 season, which ended with the club winning the Kent League Cup by beating VCD Athletic in the final, and the Hoops then enjoyed the greatest season in their history the following year. Deal became the first team from Kent to lift the FA Vase with their 1-0 victory at Wembley Stadium against Chippenham Town thanks to Roly Graham's superb late volley, and for good measure they also won the Kent League title.

However, the Hoops' fortunes quickly went downhill after Smith and Sampson left the Charles Ground before the start of the 2000-01 season. Dave Dadd took over as manager for that campaign and then became assistant manager when Simon Bryant took charge the following year. Bryant led the team to creditable third and fourth place finishes in his two seasons as manager before taking over at Herne Bay. With the majority of Bryant's players also leaving it was again a case of having to rebuild and this time the task fell to Derek Hares, who had enjoyed two successful seasons as the Hoops reserve team manager. And, apart from a couple of years from 2013-15 when he became chairman, Hares has been in charge of the first team until the present day.

The 2018-19 campaign saw Deal again spend virtually all of the season in the top half of the table only to lose three of their last four games which meant the Hoops eventually finished in 11th place, and Hares and head coach Steve King were certainly hoping to improve on that position last season only for it to be terminated early due to the Covid situation. They did enjoy a very good run in the FA Vase before losing out away at Durham side, Consett. They are hoping this season will show an improvement in their League position.

By Car

From London on the M2

Take Junction 3 of the M2 (signposted Chatham)

At the roundabout take the first exit, then turn right onto Walderslade Woods. At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit and follow the road. At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Lordswood Lane, follow the road, and at the next roundabout take the 3rd exit onto Albemarle road.

Follow the road all the way to the bottom and then turn left onto North Dane Way. Martin Grove is situated within the grounds of Lordswood Sports And Social Club and Lordswood Leisure Centre – the entrance is approx 400 yards on your right.

By Public Transport

Head out of London from Victoria, St Pancras International, Stratford International to Chatham (or use a stopping service to Bromley South and join the Chatham train there).

Get off the train at Chatham and walk down the hill towards the town centre, then walk across the high street to the Bus Station. Board an Arriva 166 service (which run every ten minutes or so through the day) heading to Walderslade.

Get off the bus at the Kestral Shopping Centre (you will see a Tesco Express as the bus pulls in). Walk across the front of Tesco then take the footpath through the trees to head back to the main road.

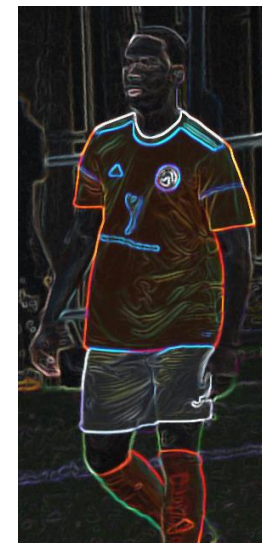
Walk north along the road to the end of North Dane Way, then turn left to join North Dane Way. The Leisure Centre will be on the right after a few hundred yards. Head along the front of the Leisure Centre towards what will be the entrance end car park. From here, walk through the car park and signs will appear for the football ground entrance which is behind the cricket pitch.

Exit the M20 at J10 and follow signs for the A2070 towards Brenzett and Lydd airport. Travel south along the dual carriageway for approximately four miles and turn right (signed Kingsnorth). The ground is about one mile on the right.

FROM ASHFORD TOWN CENTRE

Alternatively, from Ashford town centre, follow A2042 (Avenue Jacques Faucheux) on to Ashford Road towards Kingsnorth. Drive approx 1.5 miles and ground entrance can be seen on the left.

Nearest railway station: Ashford International. Ashford International is served by trains from London Bridge running via Sevenoaks, from London Victoria via Bromley South and Swanley, and High Speed services from St Pancras International via Stratford International and Ebbsfleet.

BY CAR

Head away from Rotherhithe on Lower Road towards Greenwich. Pass through Greenwich and join the A206 towards Charlton. Stay on the A206, passing over six roundabouts as you pass round the outside of Woolwich and then on towards Plumstead.

When you arrive at Plumstead, join the one way system that passes round the Bus Garage, then, at the traffic lights, use the two left hand lanes to turn left on to Western Way.

Pass straight over the first roundabout as the road becomes Eastern Way, then use the next slip road to leave the dual carriageway. At the Roundabout take the first exit to join Carlyle Road (signposted Thamesmead Central & North). At the next roundabout, take the third exit to join Crossway, then take the fourth exit on the right to join Bayliss Avenue.

The entrance to the ground can be found at the end of the road.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

There are a few ways to get from Rotherhithe to Bayliss Avenue, all of which take around an hour to complete.

The first option is the get Bus 188 or 199 to Greenwich then switch buses to the 177 which will take you to the end of Bayliss Avenue.

Option 2 is to head from Canada Water to North Greenwich on the Jubilee Line then board bus number 472, which again will eventually drop you at the end of Bayliss Avenue.

Option 3 is to head to London Bridge and take either a Southeastern or a Thameslink Service to Abbey Wood. When you leave Abbey Wood Station, board a B11 or 244 bus, getting off at Carlyle Road/Betham Road. Cross the road at the roundabout then walk along Crossway. You will find Bayliss Avenue on the right. This walk will take between 10 and 15 minutes.

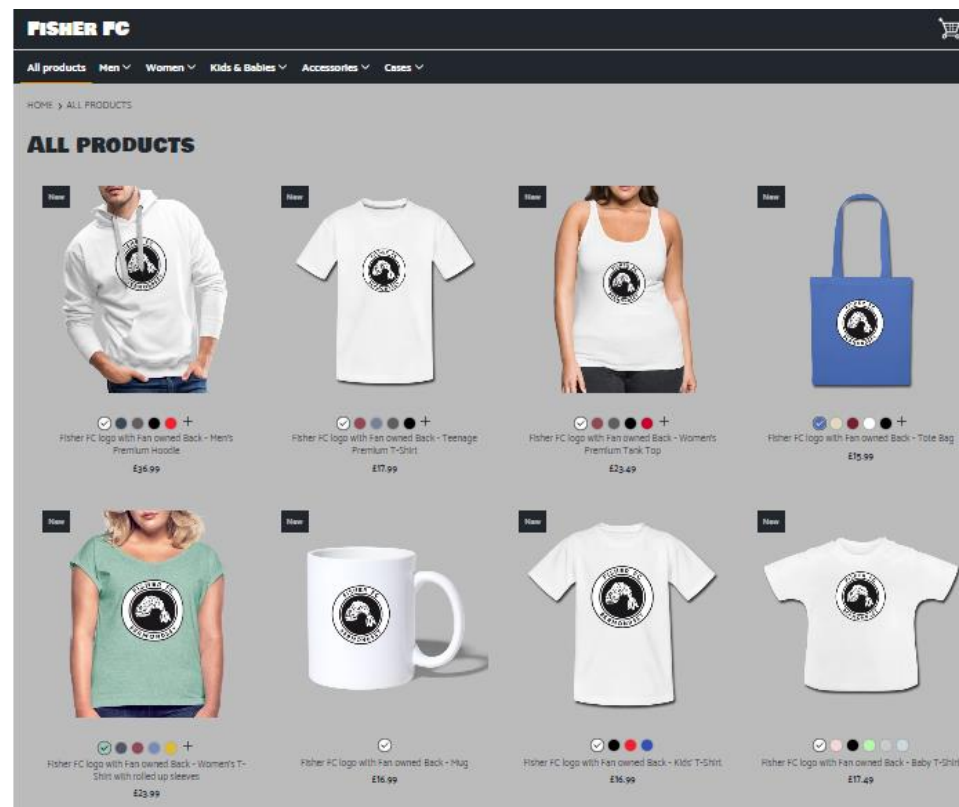
