



There were a few enforced changes for the Fish for Wednesday night's trip to Erith Town. With Peter Ojemen, Malaki Coker and Jacob Katonia all out with knocks, and Michael Sarpong starting a suspension, Jack Gibbons dropped back in to defence, while Anthony Folkes got his first start, and Harry Main returned from a brief spell away on loan to take a slot on the bench.

The game started slowly as both sides struggled to get going. The first half saw very little in the way of action to get the crowd going, and became a very broken down and pretty forgettable 45 minutes, with both sides conceding a number of free kicks, but with the defenders in good form, no real clear cut chances. A late break forward from the Fish saw Udo need replacing after a heavy challenge. Josh Biddlecombe returned to action coming on in his place.

The second half was a marked improvement, with the Fish starting brightly, with Jamie Yila, who had been kept quiet in the first half, carving out some space. The attack came to nothing as the ball went behind for a goal-kick.

Minutes later Josh Biddlecombe found space in the box but could only find the side netting with his shot towards the near post.

Jamie Yila then forced a good save from Nic Taylor, and the travelling Fish faithful watched on with optimism as the ball fell to Folkes, but play was stopped as he was judged to have fouled a defender as the ball came down.

At the other end, Dan Carpanini enjoyed a relatively quiet night with Fitzgerald and Adesida dealing with most of the Erith attacks, but was forced to make a good save to deny a powerful effort.

Rob Brown made way for Harry Main, who tested the Dockers defence on a few occasions, being narrowly beaten to a promising through ball by Taylor, before rattling the cross bar with a well struck volley (which was by far the best chance of the game).

The game then descended in to chaos. Two Erith players were Sin Binned (One for kicking the ball away, one for arguing with the referee) and before play could continue, after several minutes of arguing, Erith Manager Adam Woodward also received a yellow card.

Minutes later Main was penalised for a foul chasing a loose ball, which saw him booked, Gibbons was also booked for delaying the restart (after avoiding the initial booking for Main's challenge when the referee got the two mixed up.....)

The game was eventually brought to a close as the second half entered its 54th minute, as it started, goalless.

Before the coronavirus stepped in, Erith and Belvedere's 2019-20 season had been among the most turbulent in their history. Already among the back-markers following a 9-game losing streak in autumn, they lost their manager, most of the first team and all but two directors in an upheaval at the end of January. 26 players made their season debuts in the space of 4 games, unsurprisingly all heavy defeats, and when new manager Del Oldfield steadied the ship with a draw on 7 March it proved to be the last game of the season. 2020-21 sees a new board and a fresh start.

The Deres were formed in 1922 following the restructuring of Belvedere and District FC, a club founded in 1918 (although the original Erith FC, formed in 1885, played in the inaugural FA Amateur Cup in 1893.) The new club played its first Kent League match on 26 August 1922 at its original home – Park View, Belvedere – losing 3-1 to Chatham. In 1924 the Deres reached the FA Amateur Cup Final, losing 3-0 to Clapton at The Den in front of the biggest football crowd in England on a day with a full First Division programme. In the same season they won their first trophy, the Kent Amateur Cup. The Amateur Cup run earned them a bye to the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup, losing 2-0 at home to Third Division Reading. In 2015 the Royals became the only club to have played at both Erith & Belvedere and Wembley Stadium in the Cup!

Later in the 20s several Deres players joined French clubs and one, Stan Hillier, went on to win honours with Cannes and Sète. Cannes won the French Cup in 1932 and were runners-up in the inaugural French League in 1933 with Hillier, who went on to manage them later in the 30s: they have never repeated this level of success!

Apart from two seasons (1929-31) in the London League, the Deres remained in the Kent League until the war. In a league featuring many semi-professional and nursery sides, third place in 1928-29 was their highest finish, but greater success came in cups. They reached successive Kent Amateur Cup Finals in 1934/5. The FA Amateur Cup Final was reached again in 1938: although they lost 1-0 to Bromley, again at The Den, the 33,346 crowd was the biggest ever for a Deres match.

In 1939 the Deres lost the London Senior Cup Final to a Dulwich Hamlet side fielding seven amateur internationals, and on the outbreak of war four months later they joined the South-East Combination with other amateur clubs continuing through hostilities. Since local industry was important to the war effort, Erith lost few players to the Forces, and became one of Kent's top clubs. In 1941-42 they won the Kent Senior Cup (the first amateur club to do so for 30 years) and the South East Combination League and Cup double: they dropped only one point, scored 253 goals in 44 games and had a 64-game unbeaten home run ended only by an Army side fielding four full internationals. Former Grimsby Town professional Martin Ruddy scored an astonishing 84 goals and ex-Dartford forward Bob Collins 67, although the circumstances and the standard of the opposition – Forces teams and local rivals weakened by call-ups – make comparison with peacetime records unfair.

Having won the London Senior Cup on the weekend after VE Day with a 5-3 win over Tooting and Mitcham, the Deres were founder members of the Corinthian League, winning the Memorial Shield (League Cup) three seasons in succession (1948-50).



Along with Slough and Maidenhead, the Deres remained in the Corinthian League throughout its existence, and in 1963, having finished runners-up in the final Corinthian League table, they joined the Athenian on its expansion to 3 divisions. It was not a promotion: admission to the Athenian premier was by invitation not league placing, and Deres were denied the level their league place deserved. The 60s saw the heyday of Dennis Crawford, who holds the club appearances record with 505, and Colin Johnson, a former West Ham youth team-mate of Bobby Moore whose tally of 227 puts him way out in front in Deres' goalscoring list.

In the late 60s the Deres won the Kent Amateur Cup four times in five years and were runners-up in an international tournament in Belgium! They reached the Athenian premier division in 1971 (managed by local-born Roy Dwight, FA Cup Final goalscorer with Nottingham Forest in 1959 and of course Elton John's cousin), and won the League Cup in 1974. Tommy Ord from the early-70s team played briefly for Chelsea and lined up alongside Pele for New York Cosmos in 1976! The club chose to return to the Kent League in 1978, but in 1982 entered the Southern League as Kent champions and League Cup finalists, the highlight of Peter Peters' record 17½ years in charge between 1971 and 1991.

Life was hard for the Deres in the Southern League, with just six top-half finishes and a best placing of 7th under Harry Richardson in 1993. On his departure the club's fortunes were at a low ebb until the appointment of Mike Acland in 1996. 18 months into Acland's reign the club could have folded when arsonists destroyed the main stand at Park View on 1 September 1997. The club was based in portakabins for two years – to Acland's credit results actually improved in these difficult circumstances – before starting a groundshare with Welling United in 1999. Acland departed in 2003, and in 2005 the Deres were relegated, ending a 23-year Southern League stint. This was despite a senior debut season for Chris Dickson, who later played for Charlton and in the Champions League with AEL Limassol, and gained caps for Ghana.

Back in the Kent League, the Deres were in promotion contention until the final day of 2005-06, but were out of the hunt in the following few seasons, apart from an extra-time Kent Senior Trophy final defeat to VCD in 2009 when they were twice within 17 minutes of the trophy. Micky Collins took over as manager in May 2010 and took the Deres to 5th, then 2nd, and in 2012-13 achieved an epic Kent League title win, clinching the title with a 7-1 win v Greenwich in the final game, scoring 113 league goals in 32 matches and completing a run of scoring in 68 consecutive league games. They beat Corinthian in the League Cup final to complete the double.

But Collins resigned soon afterwards, the double-winning squad dispersed and 2013-14 was a debut Ryman North season to forget: a 16-game losing sequence, 137 goals against, with relegation confirmed with four games to go. New manager Longhurst's biggest achievement to restore the club's spirits from that position, and 2014-15 was an unexpected delight for the Deres. Alfie May (now at Cheltenham Town) scored 41 goals, they finished a strong third in the SCEFL, having led the table until Christmas, and as a bonus reached the quarter-final of the FA Vase before going out, in front of their biggest crowd for 22 years, to eventual winners North Shields.

Longhurst and eight players departed in the space of a month in autumn 2015, beginning a decline which (despite a SCEFL Cup Final appearance in 2016) saw the Deres relegated in 2017. They came back two years later as runners-up in the SCEFL second tier under Owen Jones, winning the London Senior Trophy, setting a 17-match club record unbeaten run and with Harry Harding scoring a club record 45 goals in the season.

Fisher made safe passage through to the first round proper of the FA Vase with a 2-0 win on the South Coast at East Preston FC. Having already disposed of two clubs from the Southern Counties League in which East Preston lie in bottom spot, the Fish went into the game not expecting to be unduly troubled in this second qualifying tie. However, a combination of a very difficult playing surface and a dogged performance from their hosts saw the Fish struggle to turn their territorial advantage into goals and with no extra time and the tie going straight to penalties the outcome remained in the balance for much of the 90 minutes.

Josh Biddlecombe, Luke Thomas, Harry Main and Peter Ojemen all returned to the starting line-up, as boss Ajay Ashanike shuffled the squad to give players game time and cover injuries and suspensions. However a quick reshuffle was required when early on in the game Ojemen's troubling hamstringing caused him to depart to be replaced by Dylan Pauw.

The early chances all fell to Fisher. Biddlecombe escaped on the right and advanced into the box but fired wide of the near post, when perhaps 'low and hard across the keeper' should have been the call. Jamie Yila burst into the box on several occasions down the left but each time his delivery evaded any attacking feet and Harry Main had a good effort charged down. Rob Brown also had a strong shout for a penalty turned down as he went down under a clumsy challenge having skipped into the box.

Despite the pressure the goal wouldn't come until on the half hour when Yila swung over a low corner and after a scramble at the near post Harry Main recycled the ball and poked it through to Melvin Adesida to tuck it home from the edge of the six yard box. The hosts almost drew level immediately and a break on their left saw Sam Fitzgerald clear off the line. Five minutes later Fisher almost doubled the lead, but Rob Brown's effort, when a corner was half cleared to him, was deflected onto the angle of bar and post and flew away to safety. Just prior to break Brown again had a good chance, but alone in front of goal, could not get sufficient contact on his header to steer Yila's cross goalwards, although a flag may well have gone up had the ball ended in the net such was the suspicion of offside.

The second half quickly took the same pattern as the first. Fisher saw plenty of good possession and always looked likely to break the hosts back line with Yila a constant threat. A combination of delayed release of the ball, unfortunate bounces and good tackles from the East Preston defence stopped Fisher from getting too many clear cut chances. A well-flighted free kick from Yila found Sam Fitzgerald at the back post but his header was well saved and tipped away from a corner as Fisher ramped up the pressure.

Fresh legs came on in the shape of Tarik Ibrahim and returnee Elias Armah-Tackie who made his first appearance of the season after a spell with Haringey Borough. Ibrahim's direct running on the wing saw a number of good moves down the right but the home defence always managed to get a vital block or challenge to the resulting delivery.

With the game moving into the last fifteen minutes Fisher faced a stick or twist decision, as trying to hang on to the single goal lead would backfire with any equaliser taking the game straight to the lottery of penalties. The tension was eased when Yila raced clear from half way and skipping the last defender's lunging tackle found himself one on one with the keeper whereupon he calmly took his time to draw the dive from the keeper before slamming the ball past the covering defenders to double the lead and give Fisher a two goal cushion to take into the final 10 minutes. The importance of the second goal was shown when the hosts rallied for a late flourish with a quick break ending in a shot flashing wide of Dan Carpanini's goal and a series of angled balls into the box resulting in headers flashing both high and wide albeit accompanied by the linesman's flag as the Fisher back line held firm.

The final whistle saw Fisher through into the draw for the first round much to the delight of the impressive travelling support of 56 out of a crowd of 114. Not the most fluent performance but cup football is about getting the job done and the 2-0 win certainly did that.

Fisher recalled it again Melvin Adesina at centre half for Dylan Pauw. Sarpong replaces Brown with both players dropping to the bench. Brown cut an unhappy figure as he chases the one goal he needs to become the Fisher all time top scorer.

The opening 10 minutes whizzed by as both teams looked to settle. Glebe had a couple of early corners that didn't amount to much.

Fisher forced a corner of their own that caused Glebe some trouble as the ball bounced about in the box. The ball eventually fell to Ojemen who fires high & wide.

In the 52nd minute Fisher increase their lead after another set of football ping pong on the box. The ball eventually found its way to Sarpong who fires in low to put the Fish 3-1 up.

Fisher now loosened up and started creating more chances. Udo, Katonia and De Mata had been a real threat from all areas. But once again it was Yila who was causing problems for everyone in a red shirt with his dribbling abilities.

Udo wins a free kick 30 yards from goal and Yila shoots but the Glebe keeper is equal to the effort tipping the ball round the left hand post.

The corner was half cleared to the edge of the box where Katonia was fouled. Yila once again struck the free kick and the keeper finger tips the free kick onto the bar.

Katonia was next to try his luck as he broke the offside trap. Bravely the keeper and Katonia collided in a thumping 50/50.

Glebe cleared upfield through Hudson who had recently joined from Watford. I saw him play very well for Cray Wanderers several times last season. He didn't have the best of games last night but he will bounce back I'm sure. Veteran Glebe midfielder Stacy Long was replaced by Ekshoun.

Glebe started to rally as the game reached the final twenty minutes. Jamie Philpott who was quiet on the night got away down the left channel and his stinging effort finds the side netting.

Christian Udo had worked his socks off again he won the ball and played in the equally hard working Katonia who's first touch was too heavy. This gave the keeper the chance to race from his line. Once again neither player pulled out of the challenge as they thumped into each other. This time Katonia needed a bit of treatment after one challenge to many.

Glebes Sawyer gets away down the right channel and when well placed he shoots into the side netting.

Fisher send on Wale Odedoyin for Udo to cause problems with his strength and hard running.

Glebe are under pressure and give away a couple of corners that are dealt with. The second corner being punched away well by the keeper Daniel Mamus.

Glebe also have a man sent to sin bin at this point. Giving Fisher a numerical advantage.

Katonia makes way for Brown and he's into the action almost immediately. From another corner the ball finds Brown about 8 yards from goal and his shot cannons back off a Glebe defender.

Jack Gibbons goes on a mazy run down the right besting a couple of defenders after great defensive work from Yila and Thomas. Another corner was won by Gibbons. As the corner was half cleared Sarpong picked the ball up from 25 yards and fires down the keepers throat.

Sarpong leaves the field due to injury but Fisher don't have any subs left. Sarpong goes back on as a nuisance factor more than anything else as he is clearly labouring.

Fisher give a free kick away on the right after 16 year old sub Nyus got himself involved for Glebe. The free kick was headed home at the back post by Glebe defender Mensah. 3-2

In injury time a series of ugly tackles went in from both sides as Fisher looked to see the game out and Glebe attempting to get back on level terms.

Jamie Yila required treatment after another heavy challenge went in on him.

Moments later a scuffle broke out as every player on the field plus subs all spat there dummies out. The upshot being Sarpong and Glebe sub Ekshoun saw red. FULL TIME FISH 3 GLEBE 2


With practically the last kick of the game up stepped Aderonmu to slot home his second and take the three points
