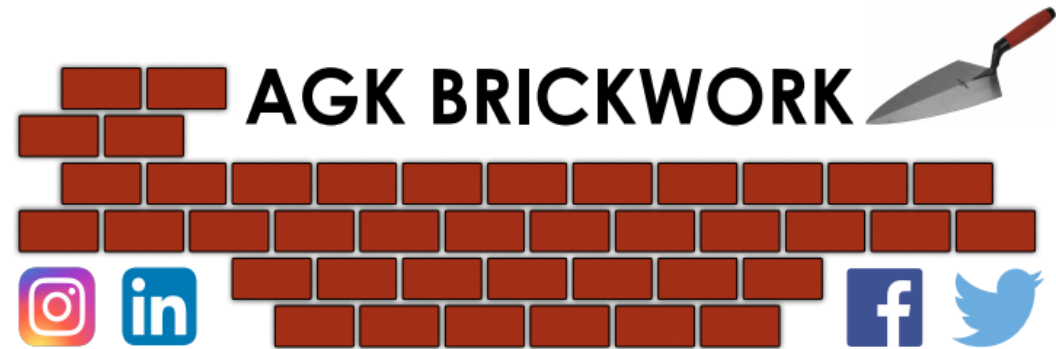

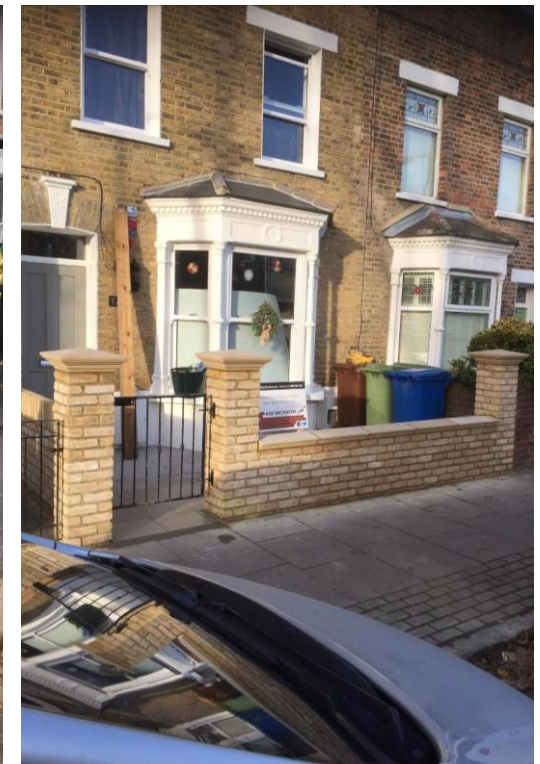

Both sides came into the game carrying solid wins in the FA Vase at the weekend. Both would have had eyes on all three points going into this local derby. Del Oldfields Erith & Belvedere team are a side that have been rebuilt during the off season with the team on and off the field receiving a complete overhaul. They certainly started off looking the brighter of the two sides. The Deres should have been in front in the opening moments when they broke down the left hand side. A neat cross was delivered into Tim Beckford who headed the ball about 8 yards wide when he had so much more time and space between the penalty spot and six yard box. Both Fitzgerald and Adesina got nowhere near Beckford. The deres had settled the better and produced the next chance with another move down the left. Hawkins scurried along the touchline and delivered a near post ball to Humber who should be hitting the target from inside the six yard box. In the opening 25 minutes Fisher had been a step behind. However with the ever willing De Mata putting his foot in and Foulkes using the ball intelligently bringing others into play every time he got on the ball. The initiative had begun to be wrestled back in favour of the team wearing black & white. Beckford who was now being marked by Fitzgerald managed to sneak away on the turn and shoots from 30 yards. Carpanini collects the effort without much fuss. Erith now enjoy another pocket of good play. Patterson the ageing veteran was giving as good as he was getting in midfield. It was his pass that led to Dasafunjo getting down the right. The jet heeled wide man burst away from Left Back Lockwood who was making his second debut for the club. Dasafunjo played the ball into Humber and he pulled the ball back for Beckford who unleashed a rocket. Fortunately for Fisher Sam Fitzgerald blocked the shot as Fisher cleared their lines. Fisher flickered into life when Lockwood clipped a ball down the left to Yila. Who had until this point been starved of the ball. Yila wins a corner that doesn't come to much but it was the first time Fisher mounted some sort of meaningful attack. Foulkes got the ball out of his feet in a central area 25 yards from goal but his effort although on target is smothered by Anibaba. Josh Biddlecombe slid a neat ball through to Yila who beats two defenders before getting the ball caught under his feet. It was at this moment the wind and rain stopped and Fisher history was made by Rob Brown making his 100th appearance for the club. Anibaba rushes from his goal to collect a high ball that swirled around in the air. He fails to collect and the ball rolls outside the box. With one touch Brown controls and with the second he sends a lobbed effort into the back of the net beating the man on the line!!! 1-0 Fisher. Rob Brown had just become the all time top scorer for the club. His 36th goal for the club and it was a quality goal. Lockwood was now getting to grips with Dasafunjo and he was lucky to get away with a clattering tackle on him. He was back on his feet after some treatment from the physio. Foulkes who had an impressive game carved a path from right to left beating a couple of players before laying the ball off to Yila who was keen to cause some damage. Yila beats two men before being tackled. Erith quickly turned defence into attack as they raced away down the right. Humber was put through and he poked home from inside the box under the onrushing Carpanini. Humber was flagged offside it was a very tight decision. With half time approaching and the rain now coming in sideways it was Fisher who extended the lead and effectively put the game to bed. Biddlecombe worked his way into the box and squared the ball across the six yard box to Yila who fires home. 2-0 HT 2-0 Fisher start the second half were they left off with Foulkes dribbling more than a teething baby. And Yila sending in a couple of corners back to back. Locky then combines well with Biddlecombe and Main. Main gets his shot away but it's blocked as Curtis makes himself big. Erith win a free kick down the right, the set piece comes to nothing. They begin to battle back into the game as a few tasty challenges are exchanged in this hotly contested local derby. Young Harry Main makes way for Tarik Ibrahim as Humphries enters the fray for the deres. Almost immediately Humphries gets involved in the game as Erith win a free kick that is pretty central. Humphries strikes the ball low and around the wall, beats the keeper but his shot canons back off the base of Carpos left hand upright. Erith had pretty much run their race as Jamie Yila began to get more service as he was now being marked by two players leaving a Fisher player spare at all times. Foulkes always busy picked up a yellow for a heavy foul on Patterson. Patterson who had been arguably Erith's best player on the night sprayed a couple of neat balls out of midfield into wide areas. Sadly the rest of his team had now given up. And didn't have his enthusiasm for the fight. Several breaks involving Ibrahim Yila Thomas and Lockwood in wide areas could not bring a third goal. Sam Fitzgerald with a header and Jacob Katonia with a blocked thunderbolt as full time approached. Both sides will know they have been in a game. I'm sure it won't be long before the Deres get off the mark in the league.

Senior football has been played in Tunbridge Wells since 1886 although the Club has had different names.

Tunbridge Wells Wanderers might be the best, though an un-used, name as ten different grounds have been used around the town. The post war years, however, saw the club almost entirely based either at the present Culverden Stadium or at Eridge Road on what is now the Showfields Estate.

In its heyday Tunbridge Wells played regularly in front of four-figure crowds and were a significant force in non-league football. The 1930's in particular were heady days when long cup runs were almost expected by supporters and Football League opposition was not unusual in the FA Cup.

Tunbridge Wells Rangers' first Kent League fixture took place in 1903. Before World War II, the club also competed in the London Combination and Southern Leagues. After the war the Wells briefly resumed playing as an amateur club although success and a return to semi-professional status were not far around the corner.

In 1954-55 the club once more progressed to the FA Cup first round proper before being comprehensively beaten by Brighton. Honours in this season included a unique treble of Kent Senior Cup, Kent Senior Shield and Kent League Cup.

After five seasons in the bottom four of the Southern League, the club duly collapsed at the end of the 1966-67 season and it was left to the determination of supporters to see the present day club formed. They entered the Kent Premier League and by the next year the team finished as Kent League runners up. The Wells won the Kent League championship in 1985 and have also won the Kent League Cup four times since the club's reformation.

On 31st August 2005 Tunbridge Wells made European football history by winning the longest penalty shoot-out for a senior cup match. 40 spot kicks were taken with the Wells triumphant 16-15 over Littlehampton Town in the FA Cup.

In 2009 Martin Larkin was appointed manager and in 2012-2013, secured the Kent Senior Trophy, the first trophy for 25 years, and memorably reached the final of the FA Vase at Wembley.

During the summer of 2015, Larkin resigned from his post due to work commitments which led to Jason Bourne being promoted from long standing player to first team manager.



There was only a handful of games on the SCEFL Premier Division on Tuesday, with the Mid-Table pack making the most of the leading group having a night off from league action.

Beckenham moved up into fifth place in the table with a win at home against Erith Town. Erith took the lead early in the second half before the Becks hit back through Harvey Brand. Tyrone Pink and Tunde Adenomon both found the net to seal the points for the Becks.

Elsewhere Lordswood squandered a 2-0 lead at home against Bearsted, with the Bears going on to win 4-2. The Lords were 2-0 up thanks to early goals Sam Stace, before the visitors pulled one back with just 16 minutes on the clock. A second half brace from Elyon Marshall-Katung and a late goal from Andy Irvine completed the turnaround and sealed the win for the Bears in front of the highest SCEFL crowd of the night, with 126 braving the Medway weather.

Meanwhile 124 witnessed our 2-0 win over Erith & Belvedere. A full report can be found elsewhere in this programme.

The final action on Tuesday saw Sheppey United travel to Eastbourne Borough in the Emirates FA Cup Third Qualifying Round. The Ites led the game for the best part of an hour after Billy Bennett fired them in front after 10 minutes. A quick fire double from the National League South side in the 67th and 68th minute (scored by Greg Luer and Chris Whelpdale) turned the game on its head, before Luer made it 3-1 seven minutes later to seal the game.

On Wednesday, newbies Tower Hamlets picked up their first point of the season with a 1-1 draw against Punjab United. Luke Adams put Punjab in front with just three minutes on the clock, but a second half equaliser from Paolo Okoye meant the spoils were shared.

Today's visitors continued their strong start to the season with a 2-0 win at home against K Sports. Both goals came in the first half, with Miles Cornwell and Euan Sahadow finding the target in front of a COVID capacity crowd of 300.

In the last of midweek's league action, Balham continued their own good start to the season with a 2-1 win over Glebe. Jamie Philpott scored from the spot in the 15th minute to put the Chislehurst based visitors ahead before Luke Hedges levelled things up eleven minutes later. Andre Cruz Rosa found the net in the 80th minute to seal the win and another three points for Balham.

Meanwhile, Chatham travelled to National League South side Havant & Waterlooville in the Emirates FA Cup looking to keep the SCEFL Flag flying after Sheppey bowed out on Tuesday. Havant raced away and showed their class, going 2-0 up before the break, and then adding two further goals in the second half. The Chats did pull a consolation goal back in the 88th minute thanks to Harvey Brown.

On behalf of all at Fisher FC, we congratulate both Sheppey United and Chatham Town for their respective cup runs this season. It's just a shame fans weren't allowed in to see the end of the run.

BY CAR

Head away from SE16 towards Elephant & Castle. At Elephant & Castle take the southbound A3, then at the next junction bare left to stay with the A3. At Kennington Park, bare left to join the Southbound A23 (Brixton Road). Head down the A23 through Brixton and stay with the road as it becomes Brixton Hill. Continue to follow the A23 south through Streatham and Norbury in to Thornton Heath.

At Thornton Heath Pond Roundabout, take the 2nd Main Exit to turn right on to Thornton Road.

Take the second turning on the right to join Silverleigh Road, then turn left to join Trafford Road. Follow Trafford Road straight and continue on to Mayfield Road. Follow Mayfield Road as it becomes a track, passing a playground and allotments. The car park for the ground will appear on the left.

BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Head to East Croydon, Elmers End, or Beckenham Junction to pick up a tram service heading towards Wimbledon. Get off the tram at Therapia Lane (one stop after Ikea).

From the tram stop, turn left on to Stonecroft Way, then follow the road to its end. Turn right on to Therapia Lane then cross over Mitcham Road, turning right first. Once you've crossed the road, turn left on to Aurelia Road.

Walk along Aurelia Road, then take a footpath near the end of the road to walk through the cemetery.

Follow the footpath straight, and the entrance to the ground will be found on the right (either through the trees or across the training pitch)

As this is a midweek fixture, please check for delays or disruption before you travel and allow a little extra time to complete your journey!

Tuesday night's game against Erith & Belvedere saw Rob Brown make his 100th appearance for the club, an occasion made doubly special as he scored his 36th goal for us, making him the club's top scorer since our reformation in 2009. We caught up with Rob after the game to discuss the landmark game.

What first attracted you to joining the Fish?

I remember when I first moved to London after finishing my football scholarship in America, I got in touch with a bunch of clubs around the South East area in London which was where I was living at the time. The three clubs that I was talking to were Fisher, Tooting & Mitcham and Cray Valley I believe. I actually went on trial to Tooting & Mitcham and trained well, and was invited to play with the first team, I think the manager was called Frank at the time who was a really genuine bloke from my understanding. In the middle of those trials, I came to train with Fisher, and the manager at the time, Dean and Neil said all the right things in making me want to play for Fisher. I was aware of the fans, but I was pleasantly surprised by how a hundred fans can make St Pauls feel like 500. I think the Tooting & Mitcham game this year away showed the voice of our fans. One of the biggest benefits of playing for Fisher for me is the 4G pitch. There's a joke that I play better at home at St. Pauls for Fisher rather than away games, which I like to not always agree with, however, I have played on astroturf my whole life from the age of 8 in Belgium to today. The club I played for in Belgium had astroturf, my high school had astroturf, the college in Canada had astroturf, and my college in America had astroturf. I believe football should be played on the ground with the ball moving quickly, and the pitch at Fisher has helped me get the best out of my game. I like to try and play 1 or 2 steps ahead of the game and move the ball to someone in a better position than I am, and sometimes on a bobbly pitch, I need to take an extra touch to do this which slows everything down where at home I can do it for fun.

When you made your competitive debut back in 2017, what was your first impression of the club and the supporters?

I remember my first training session with Fisher, it was hot in the summer. None of the boys from that training session are here and over the years I have met some fantastic people who will be my friends for life. The sour truth of non-league football is that players seem to come and go, but the fans stay with the club - and that is what I have learned about the Fisher Faithful. I remember one of my first games for Fisher, although I did play a friendly before the Millwall game, it was this game against Millwall in 2017 where I realised how special the club was and the fans are. We lost 3-1, but the fans were nothing but supportive and the atmosphere was electric. The fans are the main reason why I love the club, with it also being the closest to my home (I would still travel an hour to play for Fisher), but I get along with the fans and they reach out to me outside of football which is always nice.

You've played in some memorable games, scoring vital goals along the way, what game and goal would you pick out as your personal highlight so far and why?

This question always gets to me, haha. If you want to talk about team goals, the goal against Bearsted away was a lovely team goal in a year where we were challenging for the league and a game we were expected to win but found really tough. The goal against Chatham to win 2-1 with 10 men against a top club, is one I am proud of. There was something special about the goal the other day that I really enjoyed, it made me happier than usual, probably because it had the two milestones attached to it, but as a team, I enjoyed the football we played that day. As a team this year, I think we have shown ourselves to be direct and counter-attacking down the wings, whereas that game against Erith & Belvedere, we mixed it up nicely and played some lovely football. I personally get just as much out of scoring a goal like I did Tuesday as I do playing a nice one-two to set up another teammate to score a lovely team goal.

You have a great rapport with the supporters. Now you've earned your place in the Club's history books, what's your message to the ever-growing fan base?

Someone said to me the other day, it's not often someone plays more than 50 games for a club at this level, all be it 100 games for a club in non-league. It feels like yesterday I made my debut with Fisher and I haven't really looked back. These stats remind me of when on Match of the Day, after the highlights of a game they discuss players and they pull stats out on a certain player who has played a certain amount of games for your club and you have a moment and think 'wow, has it really been that many'. It's all flown by and that's a good sign, it means I've enjoyed the most of it. To be the top goal scorer of the club as well is a nice cherry on the cake, and I hope that someone else can score just as many goals and more to get the club where it belongs, in the higher leagues. As long as the team is winning and we are in games until the end, and most of all, bonding like a team (which I believe this team is now doing) with the help from the staff - I believe this team will only get better with each game. At the end of the day, we are all here to enjoy football and win, those two go hand in hand. My message to the growing fan base is - I hope there will be more games and goals from the team and myself for all of us to celebrate together (2 meters apart).

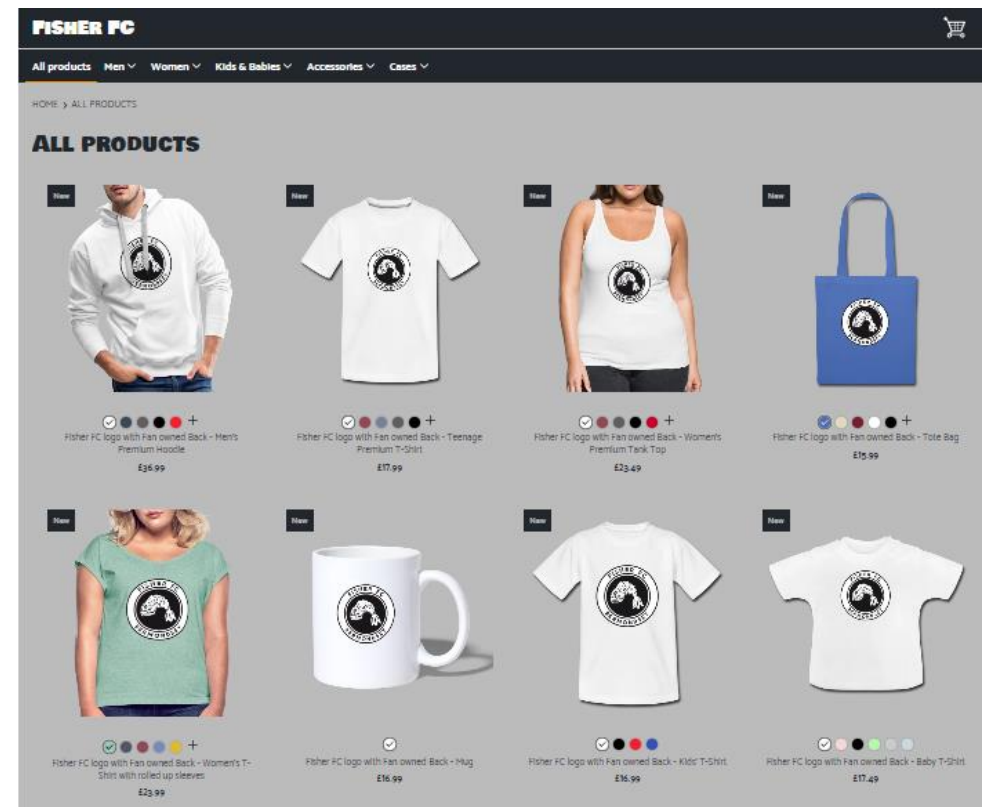
